Find out how participating candidates answered questions posed to them by the Milton Rural Residents Association

Why do you want to be elected?

Krantz: To serve the people of Milton and Halton.

Marsh: I have always been interested in local politics. I feel that I have gained the skills and experiences to provide the strong leadership needed to guide Milton council through this period of rapid growth during my 30 years in the private sector. I believe there's an absolute requirement to institute a more open and transparent approach to council and I'm prepared to make the changes necessary to achieve this.

Volpe: To bring a common sense approach to council and make a contribution to the people of Milton.

Lambert: As you know Milton is experiencing a tremendous change in both the urban and rural areas. I want to be elected so the issues that are very important to Miltonians are vocalized, defended and promoted. As a town, what we do today will affect us tomorrow. Lee: I have served my community as an elected official for 18 years and through that I have gained a thorough knowledge of how municipal government works. I continue to have a passion for this area, where I have lived for most of my life, and I would like the opportunity to serve my constituents for another term.

Massara: I would like to be elected so I can represent constituents by ensuring the following:

- Transparency, fairness and integrity of decisions for the benefit of constituents and citizens.
- Balanced urban, economic, and infrastructure (i.e. roads and transportation) growth, benefiting both urban and rural residents and business owners/farmers.
- Respect and support for rights of property owners.

Best: To serve the residents of Milton and help plan the future of our community.

Furik: I believe in serving the community and I try to do that in a number of ways — through my active service club involvement, through my work on non-profit boards and in non-profit causes, and by



being a town and regional councillor.

Malboeuf: I'm disappointed with the current state of affairs in Milton. The growth has been mishandled as have Milton's finances. I believe with my business, personal and political experience I can help get things back the way they should be in our town.

Ward: I want to be elected because I believe I can make a difference. Milton is facing serious (some might say devastating) growing pains. These growing pains have already reduced our quality of life. Unless we have someone professional and accountable; unless we have someone who's unafraid of the developers; unless we have someone who's not just another "good old boy"... This out-of-control change could completely destroy our quality of life... permanently.

Cluett: I would like to be elected to council because I feel that over the last several years family-based issues have been put on the backburner for some time. To provide a new brand of leadership on council and be proactive instead of reactive regarding the growth Milton is currently experiencing. I feel that the decisions being made today have a short-sighted focus where we should be making long-term plans to improve the quality of life, better infrastructure and do more to protect our natural resources including the escarpment.

Day: Ward 1 is affected by proposals for five power plants, all involving incinerators and smoke stacks, including the Region's EFW proposal. We need the Town and its resources in our corner for what will certainly be extended and onerous applications that will probably turn into legal challenges in court. The same is true for St. Mary's quarry, the CN intermodal terminal and the Ninth Line rezoning. I have been through many such battles before and I can offer a great deal to the process. I feel a duty to serve on one hand and I'm "spoiling for the fight" on the other hand. I also want to help slow down the frenzied growth of residential
