Hart back in the ring Nov. 18

Local boxer Matt Hart is set to make his long-awaited return to the ring next Saturday, November 18, when Stele Promotions puts on a card at the Brampton Powerade Centre.

Slated to take on a Montreal-

area pugilist, the 29-year-old welterweight will be part of a seven-fight evening highlighted by Bryon Mackie's CBF middleweight title defence against Winnipeg's Larry Sharpe.

Hart hasn't fought since July 2005, due to a shoulder injury

that kept him out for nearly a year and a cancelled fight back in June. He remains unbeaten as a pro, with three unanimous decisions.

Tickets are \$25 or \$35 each, and are available through Ticketmaster or at the door.
