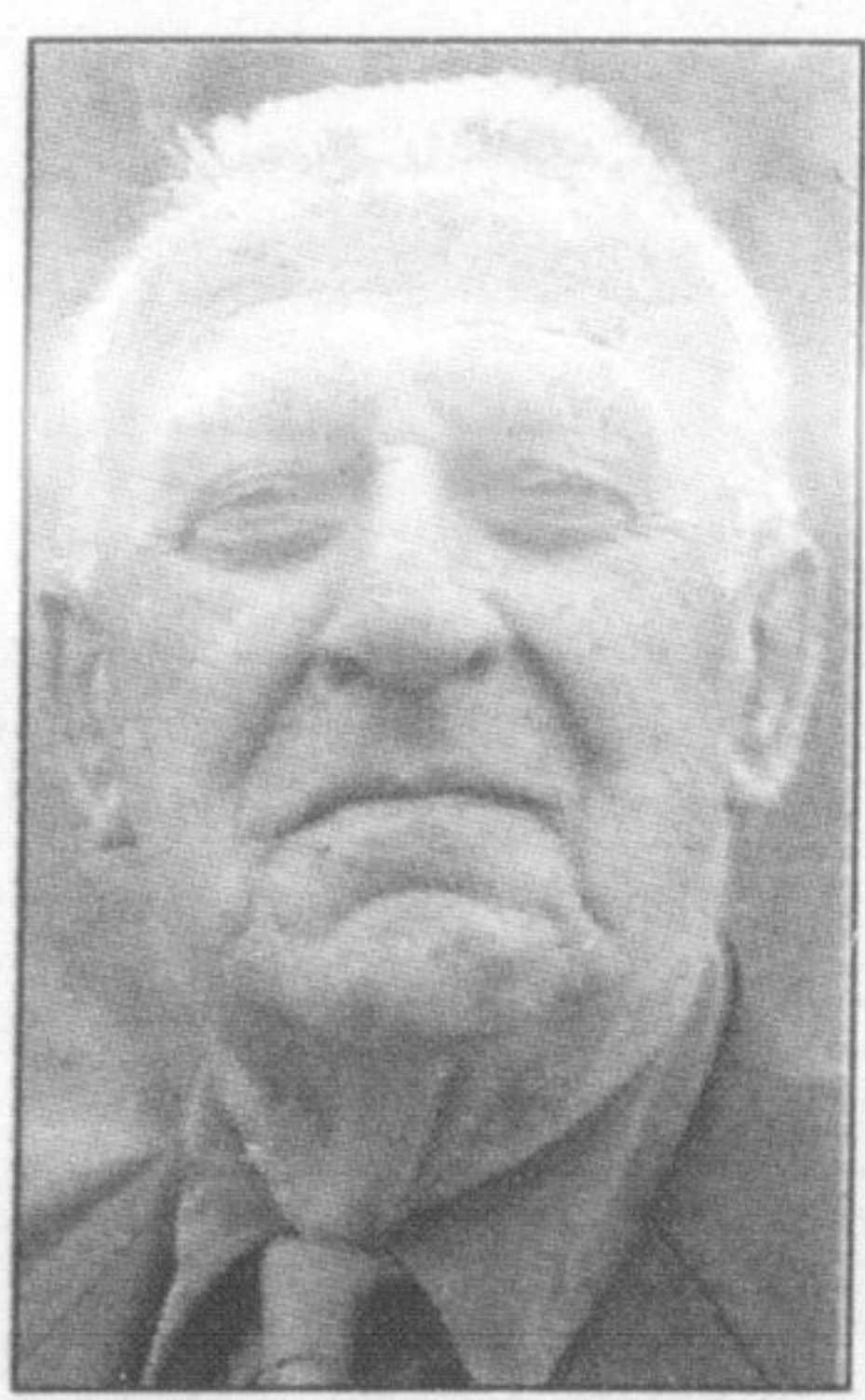
Lest we forget



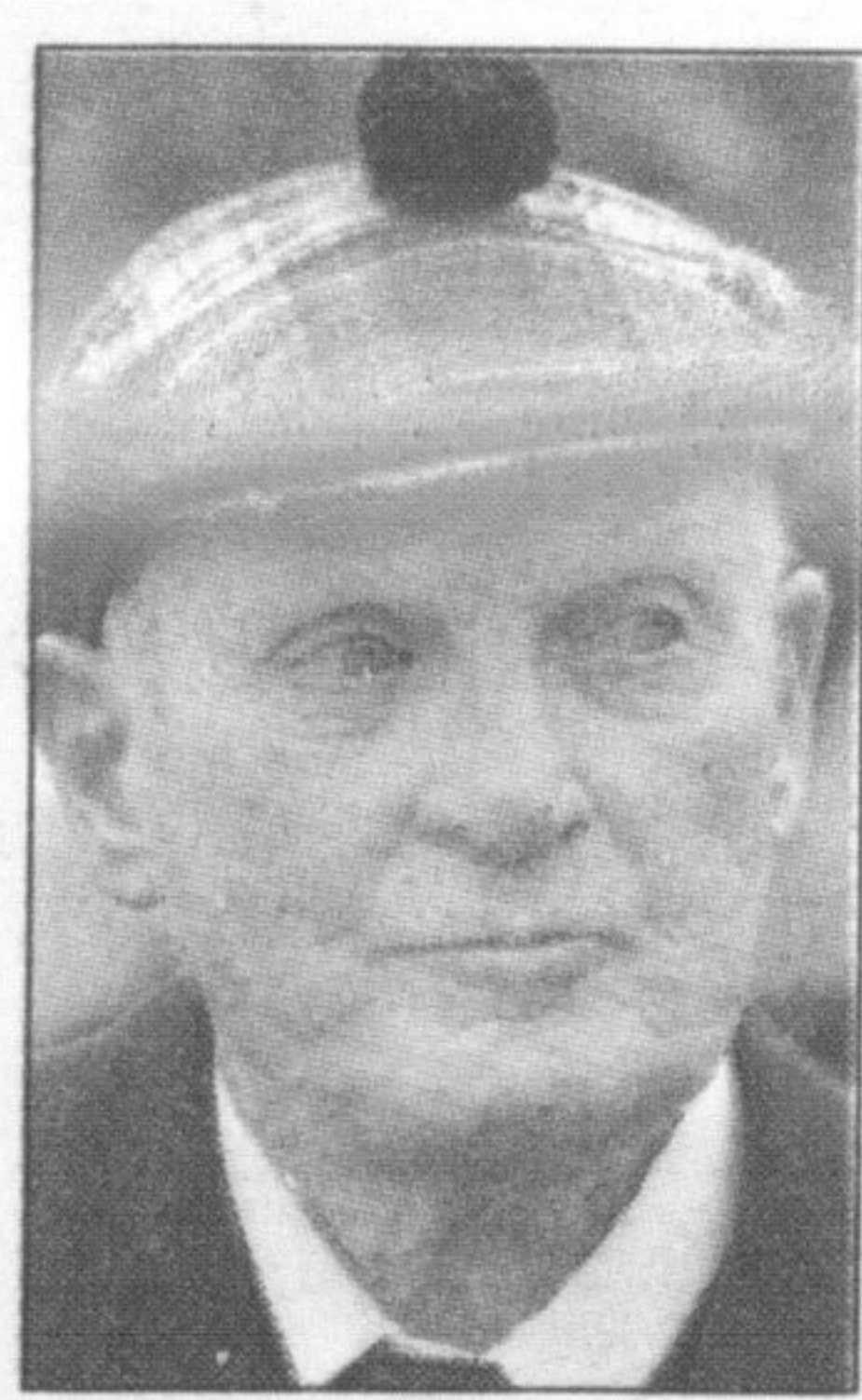
Remembrance Day services were held both Saturday morning and Sunday afternoon, at Evergreen Cemetery and Victoria Park respectively.
