

# Man arrested after vehicle bashes police car, flees

A Peru Road man was arrested last week after a police officer's car was bashed and a police pursuit ensued.

The incident started just after 3 a.m. at Slots at Mohawk November 15, police said. A man got into an argument with a security guard at the casino about parking, and police were called.

The man got into his vehicle and drove away, refusing to pull over for police, who pursued him.

He finally stopped and began talking with police, but then got back into his car and drove into the side of an officer's car parked in front of him.

He drove off and police followed him home.

A 50-year-old Peru Road man was charged with dangerous driving, failing to stop at the scene of an accident and flight from police.

#### Senior charged with assault

An 85-year-old man has been charged with threatening his 87-year-old wife with a weapon.

November 16 at about 7:30 p.m., police said a domestic dispute broke out. During the dispute, a man pointed a firearm — later discovered to be a pellet gun — at his wife and threatened her.

He then left the house and called police. Nobody was hurt.

A Milton man has been charged with assault with a weapon, possessing weapons dangerous to the public and uttering threats.

#### Street racing damages car

Two teenagers were charged after a car reported stolen was damaged during a street racing incident.

Police said a Pontiac Sunfire was reported missing by a Milton resident November 11.

Several hours later, the car was found crashed and abandoned on Third Line.

Damage to the vehicle is estimated at \$8,000.

An 18-year-old man has been charged with dangerous driving, mischief under \$5,000, breach of an undertaking and conspiracy to commit mischief.

#### Vehicle stolen

A \$20,000 Acura RSX was stolen from a driveway November 16 between midnight and 7 a.m.

Police said the 2002 silver vehicle was stolen by unknown suspects from a home on Archer Way.

Inside the car were gift certificates valued at \$600, 30 CDs and sunglasses.

#### Boat stolen

A boat was recently discovered stolen from a First Line location where it was stored.

Unknown suspects stole the blue boat and its Mercury 60 hp motor sometime between September 2005 and November 6.

The estimated value of the boat and motor is \$11,400.

#### Girl charged with fraud

A 15-year-old girl has been charged with fraud in connection with an incident in October in which a number of forged cheques were deposited at two locations of Scotia Bank.

Police said five forged cheques were deposited into the accounts of three people at the Scotia Bank branches on Main Street and Laurier Avenue. Once they were deposited, the amount of the cheques was taken out.

The girl, of Milton, faces charges of five counts each of fraud, uttering a forged document, possession of property obtained by crime and forgery.
