#### Impressive debut for new IceHawk

Clarkson's two goals and an assist help Milton earn weekend split with Streetsville

Douglas Clarkson won't help the rebuilding IceHawks for long, but the towering winger did make a sizable impact no pun intended — in his Milton debut Friday.

Picked up from Brampton in a two-for-one deal that also brought defenceman James Dimitriou aboard and sent Matt Binnington to the Capitals, six-foot-five-inch, 220pound Clarkson scored the first two goals and assisted on Jamie

Hawkrigg's insurance tally with just over six minutes remaining to aid in a 6-3 disposal of the sixth-place Streetsville Derbys.

Tough to move in front of the net, the University of Massachusetts Lowell-bound 18-year-old buried both goals on doorstep rebounds — courtesy of team points leader David Vallorani — and nearly completed the hat-trick twice.

Combined with a two-goal effort from Matt Reis and a solid debut between the pipes by Cameron Healy — the 17year-old nephew of NHL puckstopper-turned TSN analyst Glen Healy, picked up recently from the Georgetown Raiders — the IceHawks managed to secure just their second win of the season against a team ahead of them in the standings.

It also marked the first time this year that they've strung together two victories, having doubled up Bramalea 4-2 three nights earlier.

Maintaining their composure after the Derbys knotted things up with two powerplay goals midway through the third, the IceHawks struck three times down the stretch for their biggest finish in recent weeks.

But as Milton would be decisively reminded of just two days later, beating the Derbys in their own barn is a much taller order. Within the not-so-friendly confines of Vic Johnston Memorial Arena Sunday afternoon, the IceHawks enjoyed practically no sustained pressure or offensive fortune to speak of en route to falling 4-1.

Michael Kosziwka notched all four goals for the hosts, with his third coming less than half-a-minute after Vallorani cut Streetsville's lead in half early in the final frame.

The weekend split pushed the local juniors to 8-18-4-1 heading into a rather quiet week that sees them play just one game — Friday night in Burlington.
