Oh Christmas Tree

Nothing says Christmas quite like the inviting scent of a fresh live Christmas tree. More and more people each year are going back to the traditional live tree to adorn the festive abode. Here are a few tips for keeping your tree fresh looking and safe through the holiday season.

If you get your tree early and aren't ready to put it up, keep it in an unheated sheltered area out of the sun and wind. Make a fresh cut at least an inch above the original cut. New trees will absorb about 4 litres of water the first day and usually about one litre per day after that. Be sure to keep your water topped up. If your tree runs out of water you may need to make a new cut. This can be a real challenge with a fully decorated tree.

Be sure to keep your tree away from heat sources and always use CSA approved lights. Most of all enjoy your tree with family and friends and have a safe and happy holiday season.
