

MADD says newspaper article doesn't tell the whole story

The president of the local chapter of Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) is asking people not to rush to judgement about the charitable organization simply on the basis of a critical story that appeared in the Toronto Star recently.

"I think it's important for people to realize that there's only been one side of the story told so far," said Larry Zimmerman, president of the Halton-Peel MADD chapter. "I think once the whole story is out, the public will be satisfied."

"MADD Canada spends 83.6 per cent of donor dollars on MADD Canada programs and totals are a matter of public record," it adds.

In response, the Toronto Star's editor-in-chief Fred Kuntz says the newspaper "stands firmly behind its coverage."

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE DOWNTOWN BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT AREA (DBIA)
