Man tries to escape police in hospital

A Milton man has been charged with assault and escaping police custody.

Monday, the manager of a Main Street East apartment returned home to find a man he knew inside, police said.

An altercation broke out, and the apartment manager suffered a cut to his hand. He tried to call police, but the suspect pulled the phone away from him, causing minor injuries to his shoulder.

Once inside another room, the victim phoned for help.

Police arrested a man outside shortly after, and the suspect was held in custody.

He later asked to see a doctor and was transported to Milton District Hospital, where he allegedly attempted to escape, police said.

Officers chased the man down the hall and tackled him, placing him back into custody.

A 46-year-old Main Street East man has been charged with break and enter, assault and escaping custody.

Resident charged with drunk driving

Impaired driving charges were laid after a motorist left a two-car collision December 6 at Steeles Avenue and

Thompson Road.

The collision occurred at about 9:30 p.m., after which a white Ford Probe fled the scene, police said. A short while later, police arrested a motorist driving southbound on Thompson Road.

A 26-year-old Cummings Boulevard man has been charged with impaired driving, having over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood and failing to stop at the scene of an accident.

Drunk driving charges laid

A Martin Street man has been charged with drunk driving.

Police said that at 6 p.m. Wednesday, a GMC Sierra pick-up truck lightly bumped into a vehicle waiting in front of it for a train at Martin and Margaret streets.

A 27-year-old man has been charged with having over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood.

Collision leads to impaired charges

Police laid drunk driving charges after a car hit a streetlight at Ontario and Pine streets last week.

Police said the incident, which involved a 1995 Ford Escort, occurred just before noon December 7.

The driver, a 47-year-old woman of Paris, Ont., was arrested and charged with impaired driving and having over the legal limit of alcohol in her blood.

Construction equipment stolen

Scaffolding valued at almost \$14,000 was recently stolen from a construction site.

Police said that sometime between 5 p.m. December 1 and noon December 4, unknown suspects used a large vehicle to carry away scaffolding left near Laidlaw and Tupper drives at a Twin Brick Masonry site.

ATV stolen

An ATV was stolen from a trailer parked in the driveway of a Campbellville home Tuesday afternoon.

Police said unknown suspects cut the padlock to the enclosed trailer to gain access at about 4:30 p.m.

Stolen were a Homelite 18-inch chainsaw and a yellow and black 2001 Bombardier Traxter valued at \$5,000.

School broken into

Police are looking for two suspects after E.W. Foster Public School was broken into Sunday morning.

Police said two males were captured on video smashing door windows to gain access to the Coxe Boulevard school at about 9:30 p.m. Nothing was taken.

Police are looking for two males wearing dark hoodies.

The estimated value of the damage to the windows is \$500.

Woman charged in fraud

A woman has been charged with using a forged credit card to do some Christmas shopping.

Police said at about 4:30 p.m. December 7, a woman went to The Source by Circuit City at Milton Crossroads power centre on Steeles Avenue and put \$2,300 worth of merchandise — including a TV — on a credit card.

Police have charged a 22-year-old Mississauga woman with using a forged credit card and possession of stolen credit card data.

Pair of businesses entered

Two Main Street shops were broken into overnight last Friday.

In the first incident, police said unknown suspects smashed a window at K.C. Machine to gain entry. A small amount of cash was taken.

The estimated value of the damage to the window is \$200.

Suspects also attempted to break into C. Turner Ltd., a sports injury business, by smashing a window but didn't succeed. The damage to the window is \$150.

Police suspect the same people are involved in both incidents.

Purse stolen

A purse was stolen from a vehicle while a woman was hiking at Rattlesnake Point conservation area.

Police said unknown suspects broke into her 2005 Toyota, which was parked in the lot, by prying open a window.

The purse contained cash and personal items.
