A flurry of activities will take place at Milton Mall this weekend to raise money for the E.C. Drury School for the Deaf.



Money collected will go toward funding a trip to Quebec next summer for 15 grade 8 students at the school.


Today, tomorrow and Sunday, a sale of crafts made by some of the students will also be held, with the proceeds going toward the trip.


