A trust fund has been set up for a local woman who lost everything — including her two beloved pets — when her motor home went up in flames early Monday morning.

Joanne Tardiff, 41, was sleeping when her two pit bulls, Sugar and Whitie, woke her up. She opened her eyes to a wall of flames in front of the door, and escaped by kicking open a small window above her bed and crawling through it, she said.

Unfortunately, the dogs didn't make

"Those dogs were my kids," Tardiff told The Champion Tuesday. "I just hope the dogs didn't suffer too much."

Tardiff was sent to hospital for thirddegree burns on her hands and smoke inhalation.

She had been staying on the property of an acquaintance in the area of First Line and Britannia Road for about two weeks before the fire broke out.

The motor home wasn't insured.

Milton Fire Department training what technician Barry Kory said the fire was caused by a propane heater inside the trailer. It wasn't a heater that was designed for closed spaces, he said.

Tardiff, who's currently on disability leave, is now relying on friends to give

her a place to stay, she said, adding she has no family.

"I don't have anything," she said.
