is responsible for a total of 15 robberies this year across southern Ontario.

At about 4 p.m., Halton Regional Police were called to the Scotiabank branch on Laurier Avenue near the former A&P store. A man had entered the bank, waited his turn and then demanded cash from an attendant, Det. Rob Lloyd said.

He indicated he had a gun, although none was seen.

The man was given an undisclosed amount of cash and then fled down a path into a residential area where he had a GMC Jimmy parked. He got in and drove away, police said.

The vehicle he was seen getting into - observed at more than one of the robberies — is described as a 2003 to 2005 brown, two-door GMC Jimmy.

The previous robbery in Milton took place in August at the Scotiabank on Main Street.

He's described as a white male, 25 to 35 years old, five-foot-eight to six feet tall with a medium build. He has short, dirty blond hair and is usually clean-

In all the robberies he has worn a baseball cap pulled down low on his forehead. In a number of robberies he has worn a black baseball cap that says 'Under Armour'.

This distinctive cap has earned him the nickname 'Under Armour Bandit'.
