Recent RIDE spot checks and district enforcement initiatives show there's a slight increase in impaired driving investigations in Halton.



The RIDE program started December 1. Since then, five people have been arrested in Milton for impaired driving offences by officers involved in other enforcement initiatives.

"At this time of year we are reminded of the need to use good judgment when we are enjoying holiday cheer," said chief Gary Crowell. "We need to remember that need also exists throughout the year."

Halton police want to remind the driving public of the need to anticipate problems. An alcoholic drink can take from a few minutes to an hour to affect your sobriety. The last drink you consume might not begin to affect your judgment until after you begin your drive home.

Police hope people will instead call a taxi, get a ride from a sober friend or use designated drivers.
