

Burgess up for O'Brien award

Local trainer among nominees for Standardbred Canada hardware

Blair Burgess will be chasing down one last accolade before bringing the 2006 harness racing season to a close.

Milton's seasoned horseman will be vying for the coveted O'Brien Award as Standardbred Canada's Trainer of the Year — being officially nominated for the honour Tuesday.

Up against Cambridge's Casie Coleman — who became the first woman ever to earn an O'Brien last year — 45-year-old Burgess has enjoyed a thoroughly successful season, thanks largely to the efforts of two horses.

The most prominent among them is Glidemaster, who recently completed his sweep of the Triple Crown — becoming just the eighth horse in history to do so — and is now up for Canada's top sophomore trotting colt award.


Burgess also enjoyed high-stakes prosperity with Armbro Deuce, who prevailed in the Confederation Cup, and to date has amassed an overall \$2.9 million bankroll from 19 winners this season.

Glidemaster has stiff competition for his O'Brien Award, with fellow nominee Majectic Son turning in an incredible 2006 campaign that included 14 wins in 19 starts and a triumphant \$1-million Canadian Trotting Classic performance.

Co-owned and driven by Miltonian Steve Condren, Pure Ivory has secured her second straight O'Brien Award — as the unanimous selection in Canada's three-year-old trotting filly ranks. The daughter

of Striking Sahbra had a highly productive year, winning 12 of 19 races and banking \$914,893. Some of her stakes victories included the Canadian Breeders Championship, the Elegantimage Consolation and the Simcoe Stakes, in which she trotted to a career and Canadian record of 1:53.1.
