## Provincial legislation must change: Carr

Regional chair calls for act change to ease gridlock

Regional Chairman Gary Carr says provincial legislation has to change so that Halton can get infrastructure in place before new homes are built, thus easing the local gridlock.

The new head of regional council told The Champion that the Development Charges Act limits the decisions the Region can make on when and how much money can be collected from developers for things like roads.

But in order to get services up to speed prior to new residents moving in, Carr said he thinks more development charges need to flow into the Region's coffers well in advance of ground breaking for a subdivision.


"We need the freedom to make the decisions ourselves development charges)," he said. "We'd like to have more flexibility."
