

Town announces recipients of Milton Community Fund

The Town dished out another round of cash to local organizations from the Milton Community Fund last week.

Of the 28 applications the community services advisory committee reviewed, it recommended and council supported Presentations, \$10,000 to assist giving funding to 14 organizations and two individuals.

The recipients are:

- · Arts Milton, \$5,000 to assist with advertising fees
- Canadian Red Cross, \$20,390 to train volunteers for disaster relief
- John Fisher, \$1,000 to help with costs to participate in the 2006 Ford Ironman World Championships in Florida
- Halton Child and Youth Services, \$10,000 to purchase furnishings for the waiting room, accessories and sponsor a group room
 - Kinsmen Club of Milton

and District, \$22,229 to buy an insulated trailer, refrigerator, industrial barbecue, tents, tables, gas generator, wash station and portable flagpole for fundraising events

Milton Concert with fees associated with hiring performers for concerts

- Milton Dynamo Wrestling Club, \$14,429 to purchase wrestling mats, clocks and sin-
- Milton Minor Baseball Association, \$11,079 to help purchase pitching machines and protective screens and to support training for coaches and umpires
- Milton Skating Club, \$13,920 to train program assistants, implement on-line registration, purchase computer equipment and hire temporary office staff

· Milton Youth Soccer Club, \$12,750 to assist with fees for coach and referee clinics, hosting an Ontario cup tournament game and hiring staff

· Nassagaweya Tennis Club, \$2,000 to offer a teen drop-in program

- North Halton Girls Hockey Association, \$4,200 to support training fees for volunteers and coaches

Driver sought after elderly woman hit by car

A 71-year-old woman visiting from Macedonia was hit by a vehicle Thursday morning at an Ontario Street crosswalk.

The woman was walking south, crossing Childs Drive, at about 11 a.m. when she was struck by a blue vehicle driven by a blond female.

At the time of the incident, the victim motioned to the driver she wasn't injured, and the driver left the scene, police said. But later she felt ill and an ambulance was called. X-rays revealed she'd sustained a fracture to her left hip.
