"We incur traffic congestion because we allow development without building the roads to handle the increased volumes of traffic," he said. "We are going to take a very hard line with developers."

He also said he feels the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) reform has a role to play in the issue.

"We must fight to get the changes by the Province that will allow us to make the decisions about our development here in Halton, not by the OMB," he said, noting local councillors are the best decision makers when it comes to when and where development should go.

He went on to say he plans to use his office and his background as a former MPP to lobby the Province on other growth-related issues, like school and hospital funding.
