Who Should Have a Hearing Test?

Hearing loss, although often thought of as a condition related to aging, spans across all ages.

Some people are born with hearing loss. In Ontario, all parents are offered a hearing screening for their newborns even before leaving the This is implemented hospital. through the IHP (Infant Hearing Program). Parents may also access this program if they miss the screening or their babies are born at home. Children with factors that put them at risk for a progressive hearing loss (a loss that becomes worse over time) will be monitored up to 3 years of age. Young children are often followed for hearing concerns if there is a history of ear infections or fluid in the middle ear. Hearing is tested to diagnose any problems and may be retested following any intervention

to ensure that hearing levels are within the normal range.
