

Firefighters' flashing green light means please yield

With yesterday marking the start of Green Light Awareness Week in Milton, the fire department is reminding residents to yield to firefighters on their way to the station.

The event has been held annually for the last several years to increase public awareness that Milton's part-time/volunteer firefighters display a flashing green light in their personal vehicles when responding to an emergency.

This year, green lights have been installed on the front of fire trucks to add consistency to the program. Special signs have also been put up around the community to help educate the driving public.

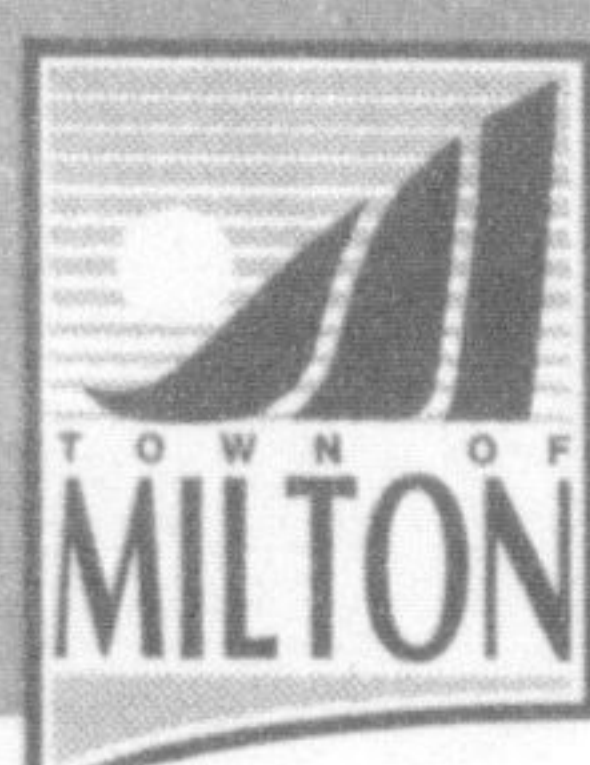
"Green Light Awareness Week is an important initiative to help educate our community about the essential service our part-time firefighters provide," said Fire Chief Larry Brassard. "We ask that everyone who

drives in Milton support our firefighters by being courteous and yielding the right of way to them when their green lights are flashing in response to an emergency."

The use of green lights by part-time firefighters is permitted through a provision in the Province's Highway Traffic Act, but the use of lights on fire trucks and the street signs are unique to the towns of Milton

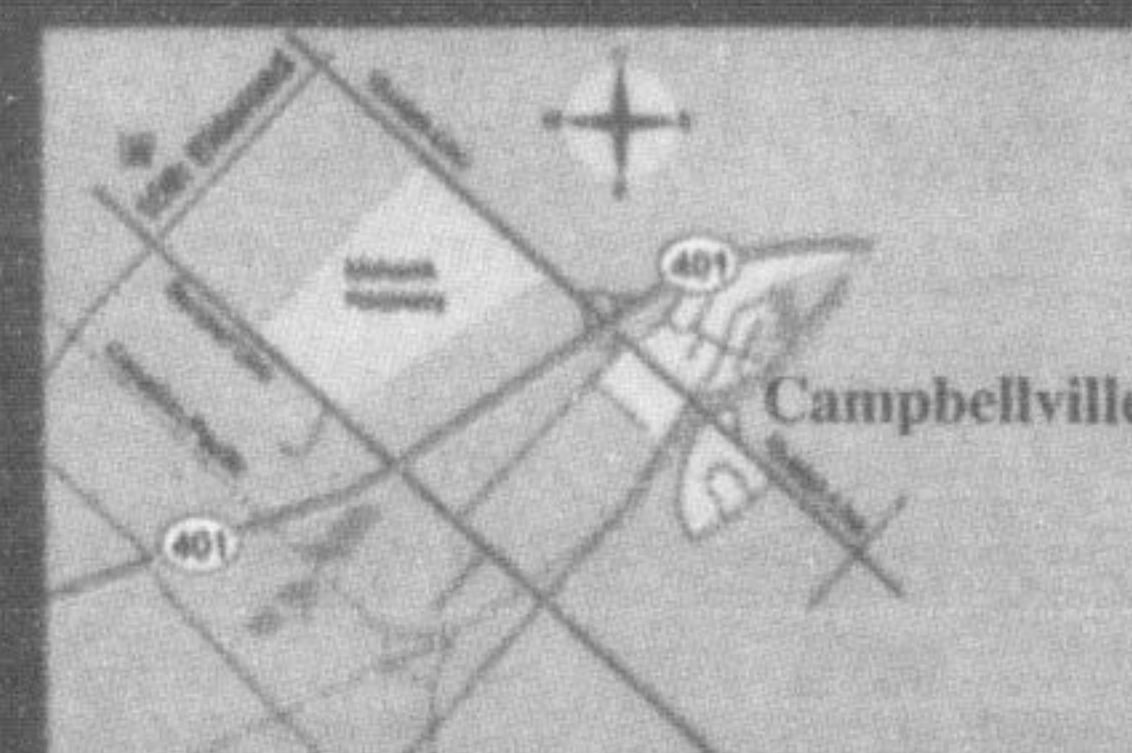
