Locals aid latest triumph for MAC

V-ballers reign supreme in Kitchener

As if winning back-to-back gold medals in just their first year of existence wasn't already impressive enough.

Now the Mountain Athletic Club (MAC) 17-and-under

girls volleyball team — which includes co-captain Courtney Copeland of Campbellville and Milton's Charlotte Swanson — is prevailing in higher age competition as well.

MAC did so earlier this month, delivering an unbeaten campaign on the way to victory at the Zone A 18U Bugarski Cup in Kitchener.

Gamely aided by its local duo, the recently-established club gutted out three-set wins over the Chatham Ball Hawks and London Forest City in the quarter-finals and semifinals respectively before sweeping the Niagara Splash 25-16, 25-18 in the title match.

Copeland had the team's highest kill per centage of the weekend — delivering 18 in the semis alone to help MAC rally from a game-one loss — and managed four ace serves in a 25-16, 25-20 opening round decision over the Oakville Thunder.

Proving to be MAC's second-most dependable server in its latest gold-medal run, Swanson had 14 aces overall and provided a solid two-way effort to fuel her squad's attack.

With the recent triumph, the Hamilton-based club qualifies for Tier 2 competition at the 18U level — a highly credible follow-up to the two golden performances in 17U play earlier this season.
