Milton councillor Brian Penman was acclaimed as Conservation Halton's board chair at its inaugural meeting February 22.

The position isn't a new one for Penman, who served as the Conservation Halton (CH) board chair last year. In total, he has been a director for 27 years including 11 as chair.

"All in all, 2006 was an exceptional year for Conservation Halton," Penman said. "It was a very good year for conservation and environmental protection and our important work will continue in 2007."

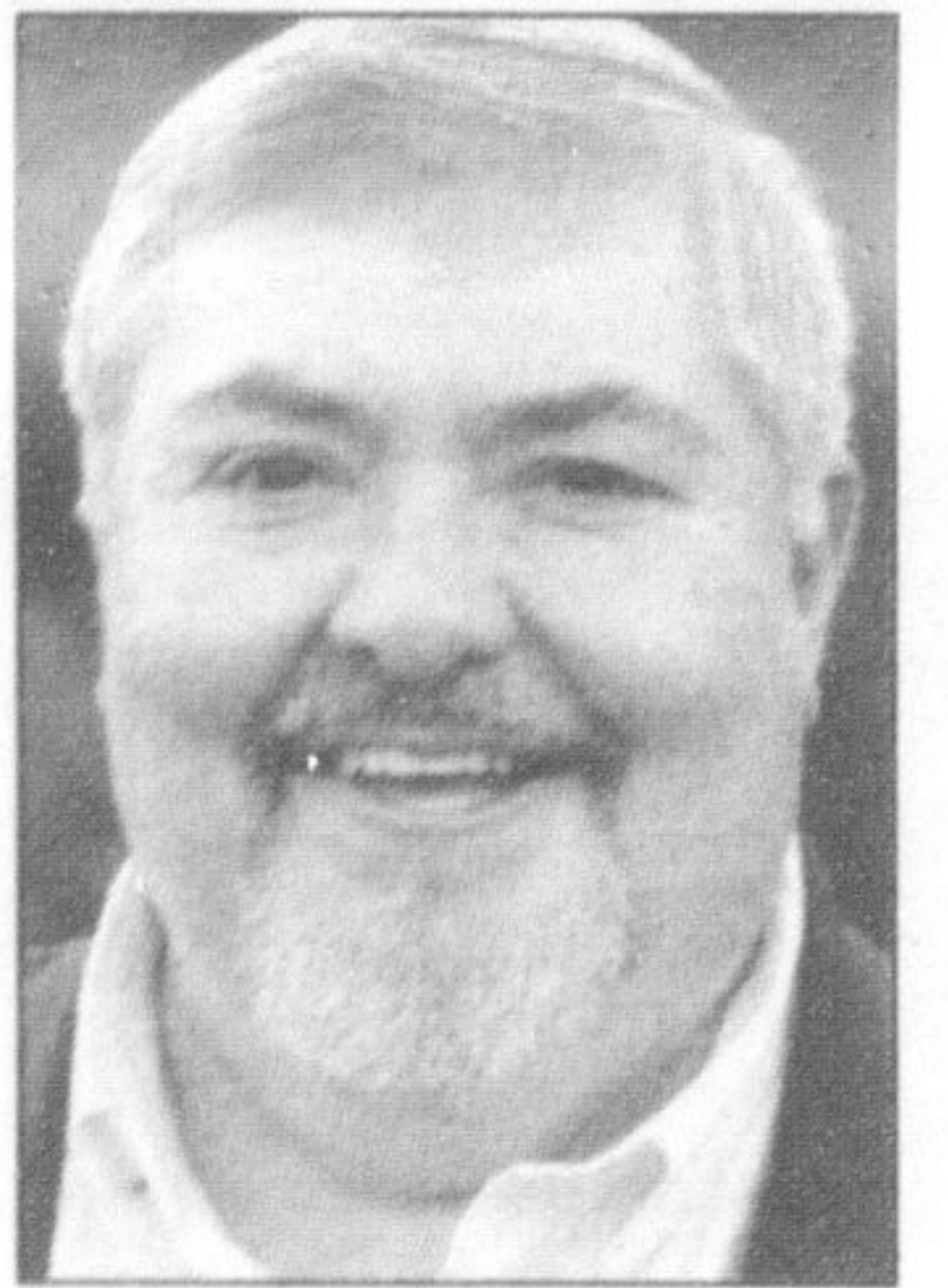
John Vice, a citizen appointee from Burlington, was acclaimed as vice chair. He's been on the board for three years.

Glen Eden Ski and Snowboard Centre has special events planned from March 12 to 16 for students, including its March Break Adventure Camp.

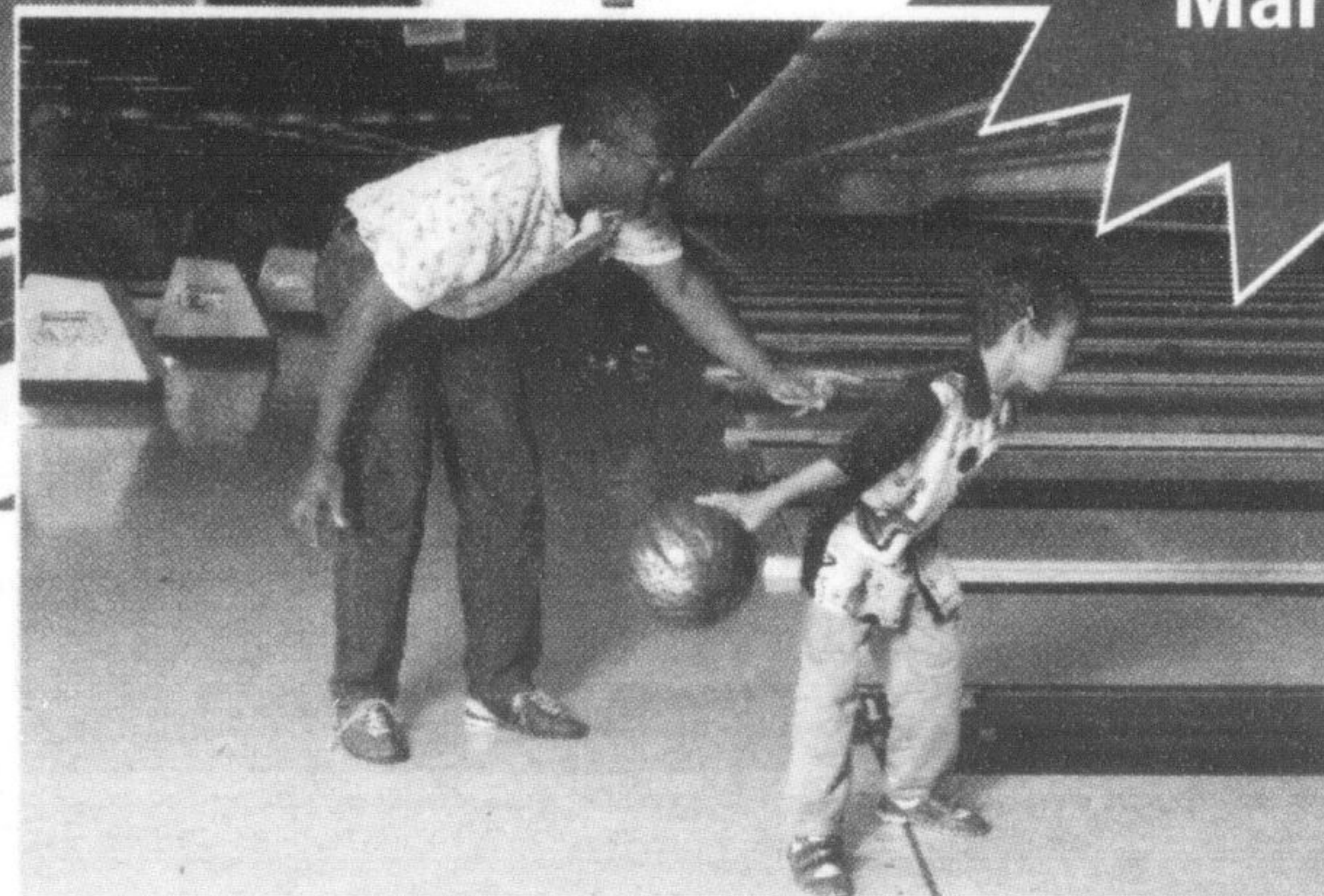
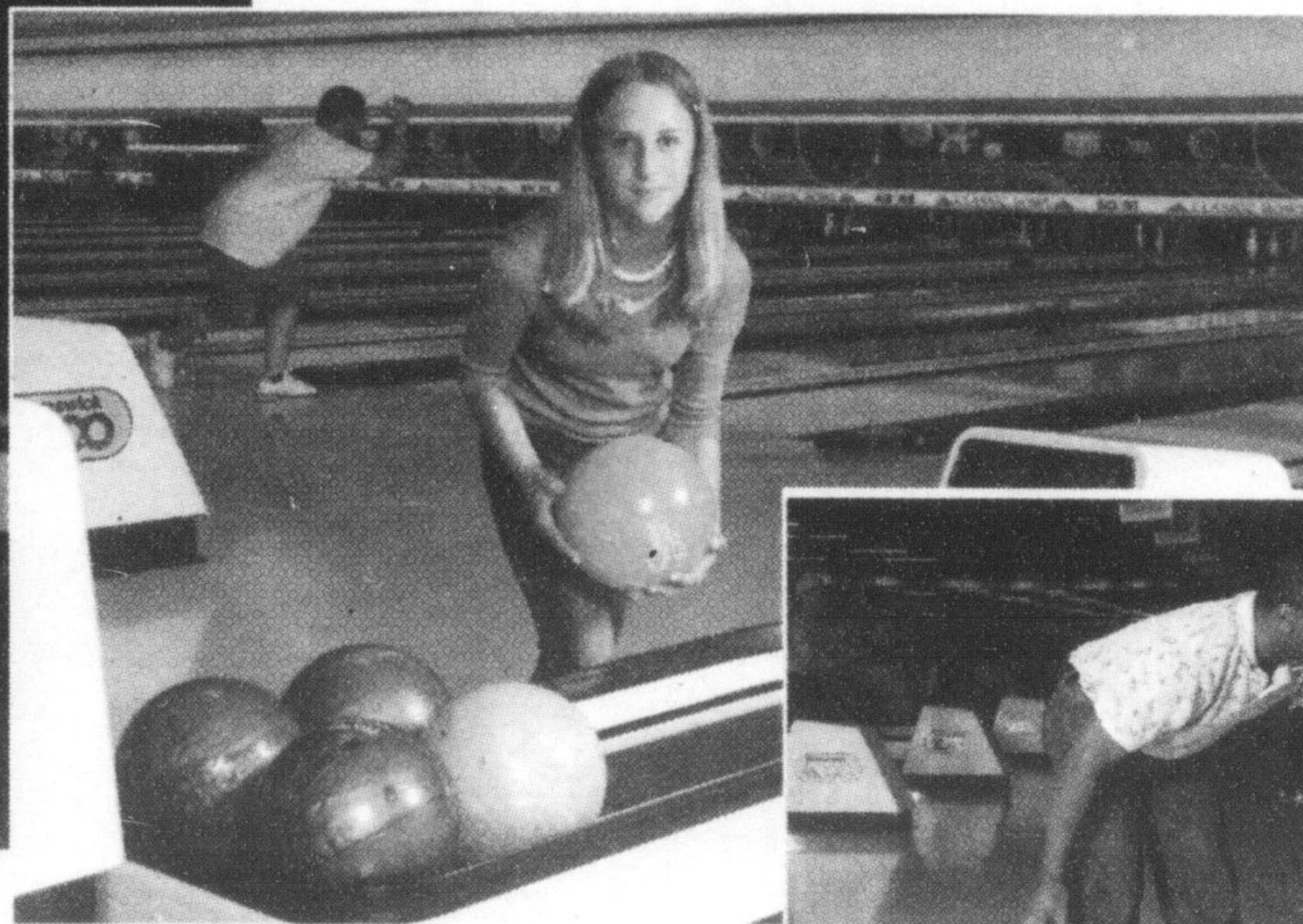
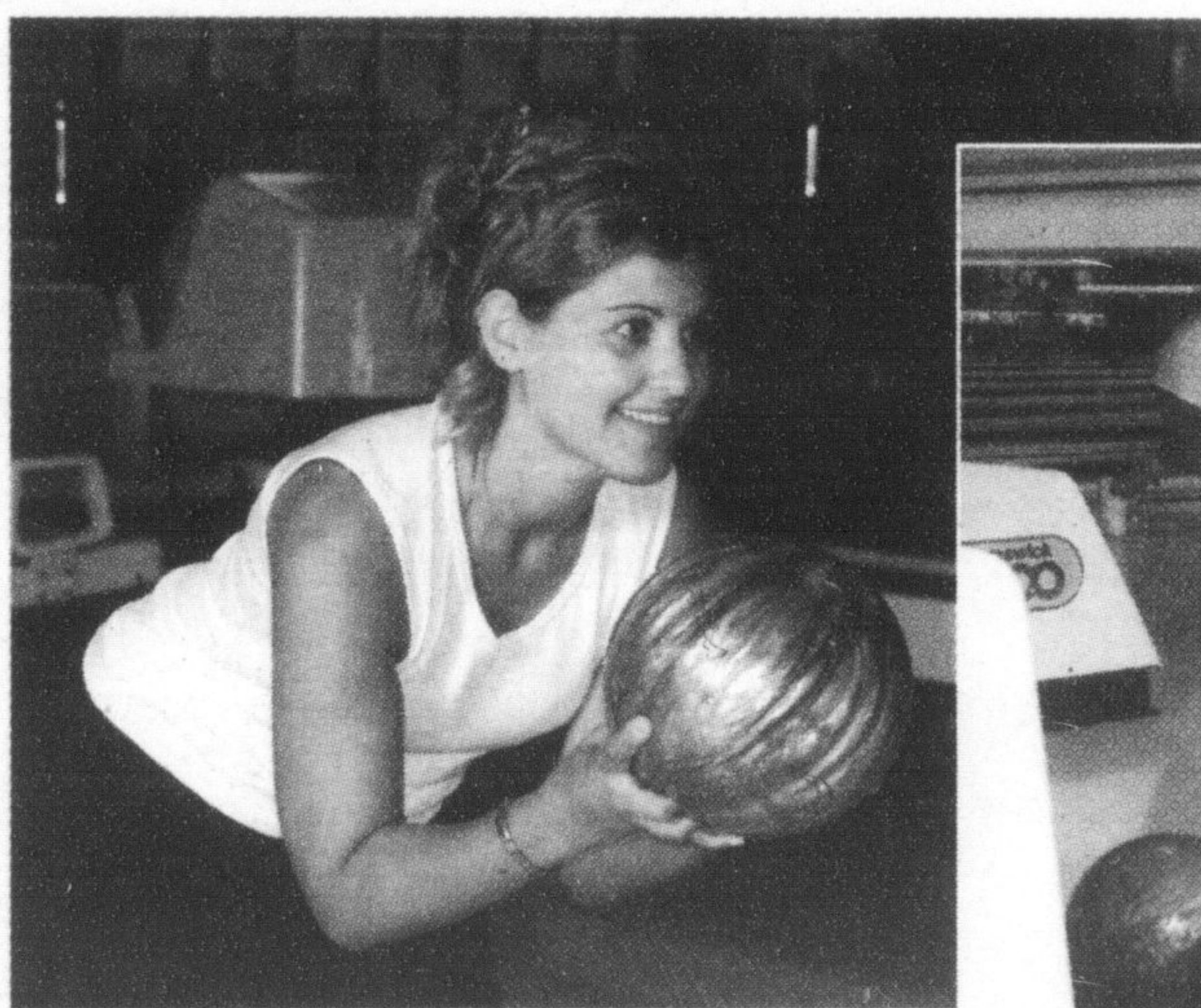
This camp includes five days of lessons with a professional certified instructor and lift tickets for the remainder of each day. You can save money by pre-purchasing equipment rentals.
