Canadian magazines, newspapers, newswires, and reference books.

Most of these tourist locations will have Web sites that will be of great assistance to you for hours of operation, admission costs, etc. The library has many public Internet computers available for you to use. Milton Public Library now has wireless capabilities, so bring your laptop and relax while you research your next trip. There is a great "Travel" link on the library's Web site under Best of the Web. Whether you are traveling here or abroad, this link will assist in your planning.









