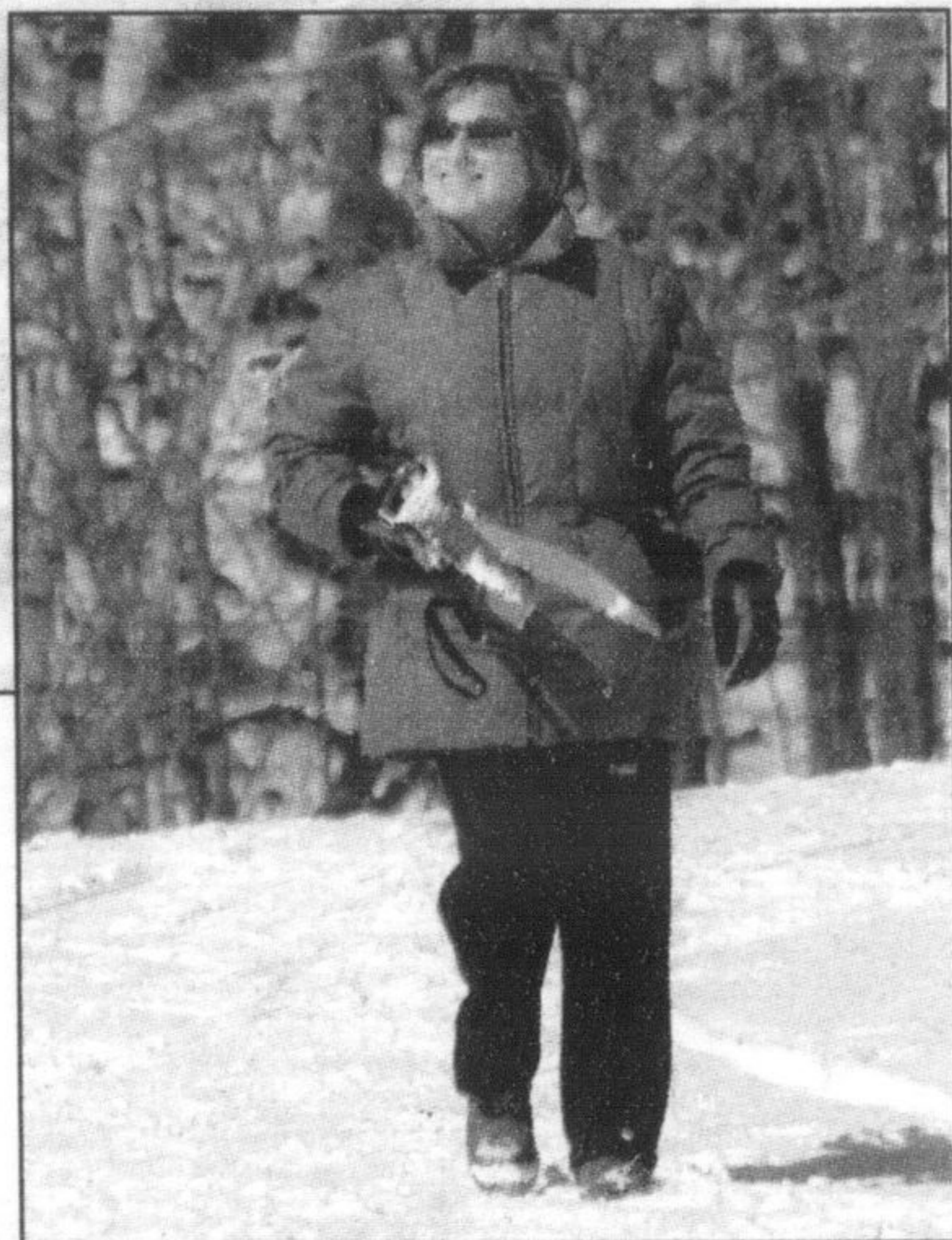

## Safe Living Series to deal with wide variety of issues

Next meeting set for March 27

With topics such as 'Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design' and the North America Cup being discussed at the fourth Safe Living Series meeting being held next Tuesday, March 27, the Nassagaweya Community Consultation Committee (NCCC) is expecting a good turnout, said organizer Jan Mowbray.

"This public information meeting will have several presenters attending including the Halton Police who will be discussing how to prevent your home from being burglarized and the importance of calling the police, as well as (Milton) Fire Chief Larry Brassard and Halton police superintendent Joe Taylor. Woodbine Entertainment Group will also be presenting Mohawk Race Track's season's events," said Mowbray. "We are expecting a lot of residents to attend."

Started in 2005, the Safe Living Series has received a great deal of support from local businesses and residents alike. It's aimed at keeping rural residents informed about issues of significant interest to them, including keeping their homes safe, well water testing, the Rural Watch program, and even Internet safety.

Many local businesses set up displays and distribute information including Woodbine Entertainment, the Champion, Crime Stoppers, Milton Fire Department, Halton Regional Police Service, Halton EMS, Dufferin Aggregates, the Milton District Hospital, and the NCCC for the Rural Watch program and the Roadside Clean-up, added Mowbray.

Held at the Nassagaweya Community Centre on Guelph Line in Brookville, the meeting begins at 6 p.m. with formal presentations starting at 7:15 p.m. Admission is free and refreshments will be served.
