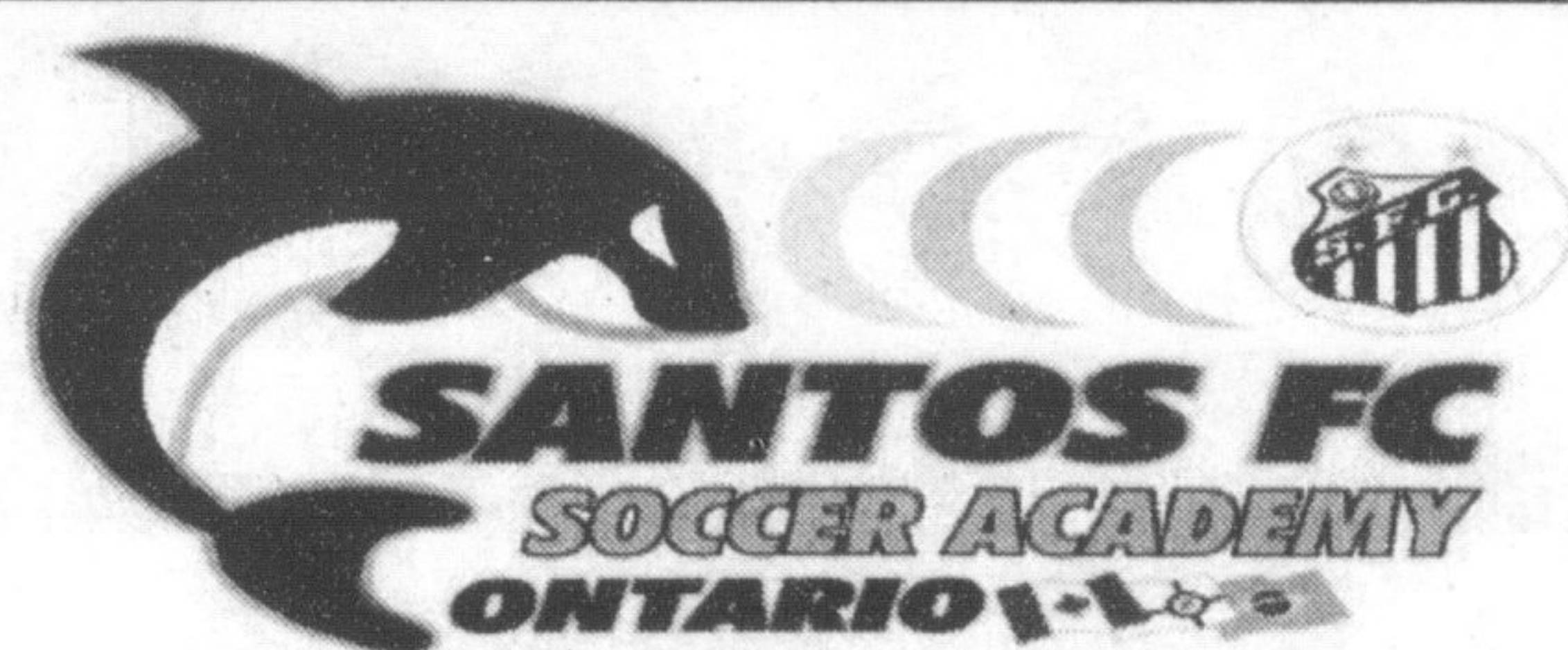

Man attempts to rob motorist

A young Milton woman was shaken up Tuesday night after a man attempted to rob her while she was in her vehicle.

Police said the 27-year-old woman was driving west-bound on Britannia Road in the area of Sixth Line when a white SUV approached from behind and pulled in front of her, forcing her to stop.

A man wearing a balaclava got out of his vehicle and began banging on her window, demanding that she give him whatever she had, police said. The man tried to open the car doors, but they were locked.

When another car approached the scene, the woman flashed her high beams and the suspect, alarmed, got back in his vehicle and drove away, traveling eastbound on Britannia.

The suspect is described as a black male, about five-foot-nine with a medium build. He was clean-shaven and had a deep voice with no accent. He was wearing a black or dark green hooded sweatshirt.

He was driving a newer model SUV that was large, white and had four doors.

Teens arrested in school vandalism

Police arrested six local teens after an elementary school was trashed to the tune of \$10,000 — damage that included racial profanities drawn on blackboards.

The break-in occurred Saturday at about 8:30 p.m. at Robert Baldwin Public School on Wilson Drive. A security company notified police who arrived to find two males on the scene, one who was attempting to flee. Both were arrested.

Police discovered extensive damage inside the school including paint thrown in the hall, windows broken, food scattered, shelves toppled and beer bottles broken. Computers were destroyed and equipment smashed, police said.

Nothing was stolen.

After an investigation, four additional youths were arrested.

Charged with break and enter and mischief over \$5,000 are four 14-year-old boys and two 15-year-old boys. All are

Milton residents. They were released on bail to their parents.

Police are also investigating whether racist graffiti found in the schoolyard is related to the incident.

The damage was caused sometime between March 14 and Sunday, and included profane comments and swastikas drawn in black marker on playground equipment.

Referee assaulted

An Oakville hockey player has been accused of cross-checking a Milton referee whose call he took exception to.

The incident occurred March 14 at the Milton Sports Centre on Derry Road.

Towards the end of the third period, a referee gave a player a minor penalty, police said. The referee was then hit with a stick on his right arm. The referee — who wasn't seriously injured — ended the game and police were called.

A 22-year-old Oakville man has been charged with assault with a weapon.

Counterfeit cash charges laid

Police have laid charges in connection with counterfeit money that was used at a local restaurant.

The evening of December 1, two men ordered drinks at Casey's on Maple Avenue and one of them used a \$20 bill to pay. Additional purchases were made, and each time a \$20 bill was used.

An investigation later revealed the money was counterfeit.

A 19-year-old Brampton male has been charged with possession of counterfeit money, uttering counterfeit money, breach of recognition and failure to comply.

Teen charged with break-ins

A 15-year-old male has been charged in connection with four vehicle break-ins last week.

The break-ins occurred March 14 at about 10:30 p.m. in the Bronte Street area. The vehicles, which were all unlocked, sustained various amounts of damage.

The next day a teen at a youth detention facility was arrested. He's been charged with three counts of theft, two counts of mischief, breach of an undertaking and being unlawfully at large.
