Price's Eagles declaw UNH Wildcats to secure Hockey East championship

Take on St. Lawrence in Sweet 16 round tomorrow

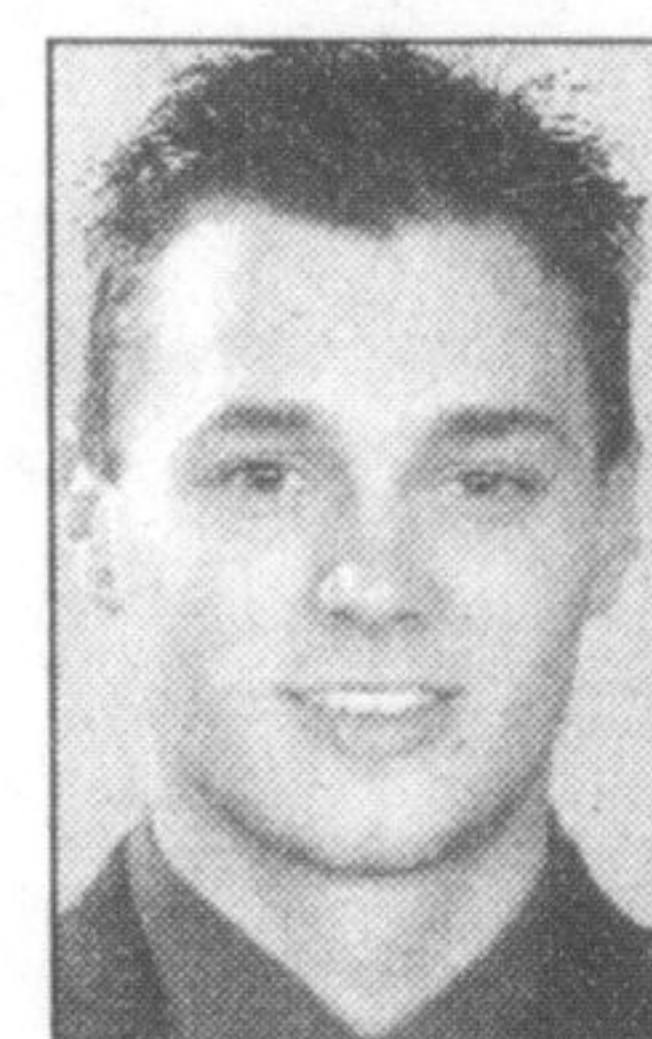
Matt Price sure didn't have to wait long to get into some high stakes play in the NCAA.

A freshman forward with powerhouse Boston College, the 18-year-old Miltonian now finds himself just two wins away from the Frozen Four - and with his Eagles still basking in the glow of Saturday's Hockey East championship triumph over the third-ranked New Hampshire Wildcats.

An NCAA championship finalist last spring, BC jumped out to an early lead

on the way to toppling the Wildcats 5-2 - which marked their 10th straight win and 14th in 16 games. The Hockey East title victory followed a 6-2 semifinal decision over archrival Boston University just the night before.

While struggling to crack the veteran-laden lineup through the early

stages of the season, Price has played more often than not lately and competed in the Eagles' record-breaking seventh Hockey East championship win.

One of only two Canadians on the team, the five-foot-10-inch, 183-pounder has two goals and three assists in 22 games this year.

Boston College will now take on the St. Lawrence Saints tomorrow in the Northwest Regional Semifinals in Manchester, New Hampshire. The winner will battle either Miami or New Hampshire Sunday for a berth to the Frozen Four in St. Louis, Missouri.

composure they might not otherwise have enjoyed.

"Giving up that late equalizer (with two-and-a-half minutes left) was certainly discouraging, but we seemed to be fairly confident going into over-

time," said Novak, who had three assists in 21 games this season. "Of course there's always the thought that a lucky bounce is going to win it, but to be the best you've got to beat the best, and we just had a feeling we were going to do that this year."

If there's one downside to last week-end's national victory, it's that it didn't come with fellow defenceman and Miltonian Bryan Gent, who was just a year shy of hoisting the trophy with Oswego - having just graduated from the New York State school and moved on to the Southern Professional Hockey League ranks this season.

"It's too bad he couldn't have been here for this, especially since it could be the first of a few (national championships)," Novak said optimistically. "We've got most of the team back next year, and with a national title now under our belts and a new facility, the top players are going to want to come here. We're only going to get better."
