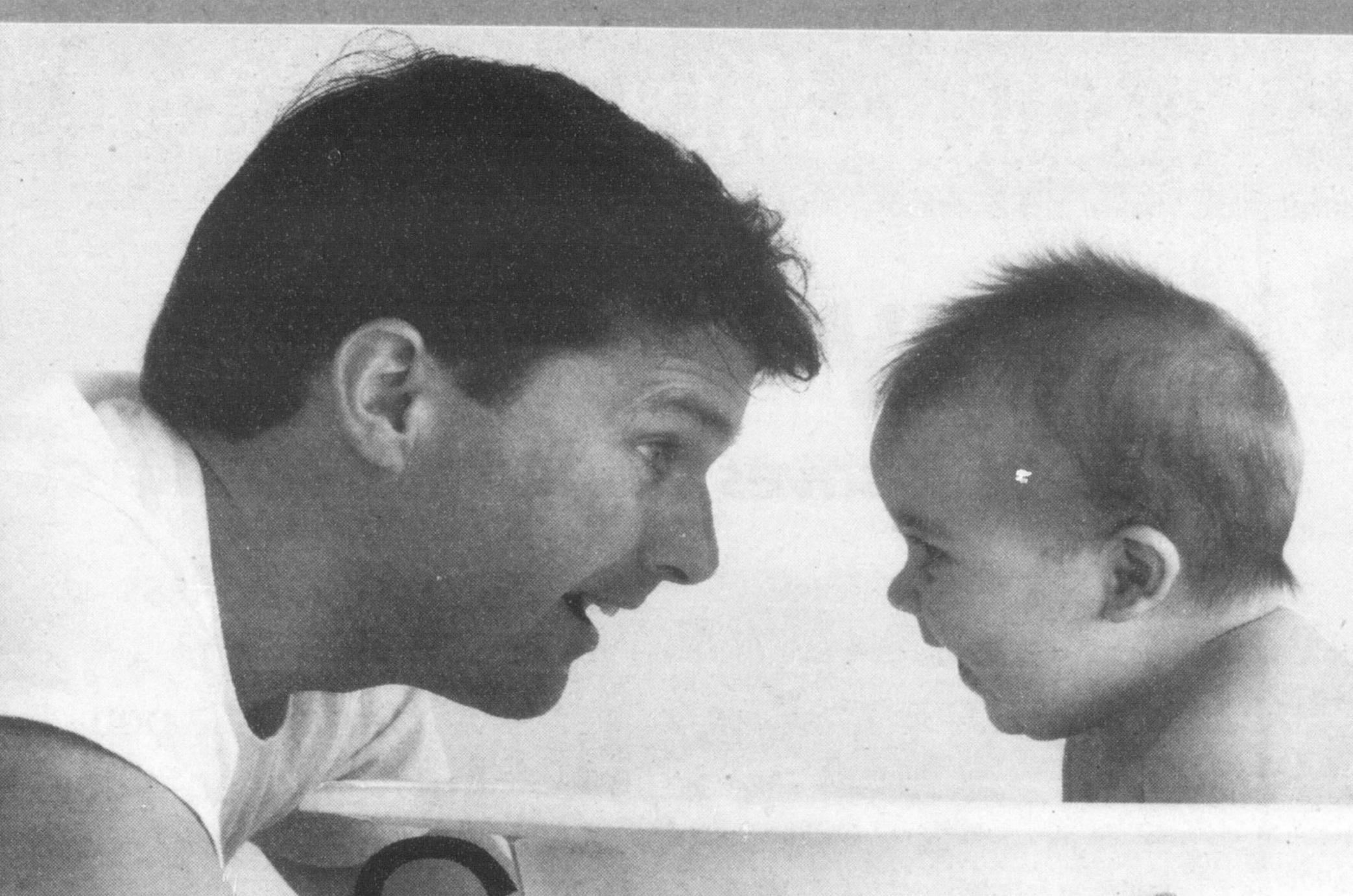
tips and respond to residents' questions and gardening problems.
