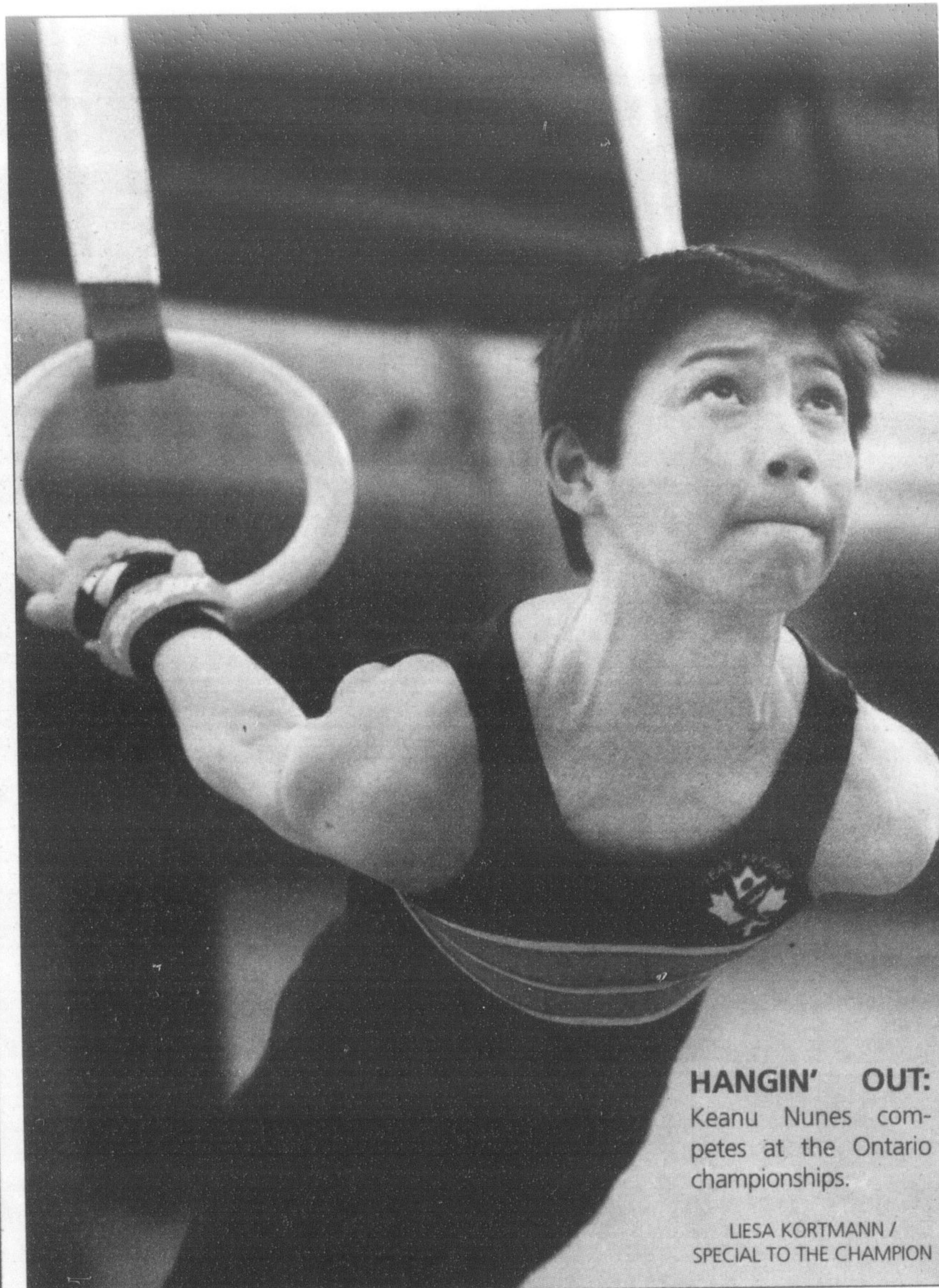

## Nunes' Ontario medal run continues

### Level 3 newcomer claims overall silver

Keanu Nunes took a step up in the level of competition, but only a small step back in his results.

A year after winning Ontario's Level 2 title, the talented young gymnast took all-around silver in the Level 3 10-to-12-year-old boys division recently at the Rogers Men's Artistic Gymnastics Provincial Championships in Oakville.

The Futures Gymnastics Club member secured five event medals en route to overall second-place honours, including gold on parallel bars.

Nunes' all-around score of 70.683 placed him behind only Mark Syptak of Mississauga, who finished with a total of 71.616. Nunes had taken the overall title ahead of Syptak at the third and final provincial qualifier a month earlier, but this time Syptak came out on top thanks to victories in four events.

"I think I could have done better," said 11-year-old Nunes, pointing to a 12th-place finish on vault as an area to improve on.

Still, Nunes managed to take home his third all-around provincial medal in as many years and finished within a single point of Syptak, who was competing in Level 3 for the second year — as opposed to his first-time Milton rival — and won't be back at the division next spring.

Both Nunes and Syptak, as well as Futures teammate Andrew Staffiere, advance to the Eastern Canadian championships, slated for next week in Saint John, New Brunswick.

The local gymnast said he'll be training hard for the event. "I'm going to put in some harder skills," he said.

At least one event Nunes won't have to fortify his efforts in too much is parallel bars, with his victory in Oakville — earning an impressive score of 12.300 — representing the latest in a series of golden performances. "I just like it and I'm really strong at it," said the grade 5 E.W. Foster student.

Nunes also earned three silver medals, missing a second gold on floor, where his score of 11.533 was narrowly eclipsed by Syptak's 11.566. His medal haul included silvers on the pommel horse and high bar, as well as a bronze on rings.
