Fundraising event aids Literacy North Halton

Not much, but both continue to be a theme for The Grate Groan-Up Spelling Bee, an annual event that's set for Thursday at Halton Hills Banquet Hall in Milton.

This year's organizers will be offering sports car racing fans the opportunity of a lifetime, with a chance to bid on a ride at a track in a Ford GT with a 550-hp engine that's been modified for even more power and torque.

Proceeds from the live auction will go toward Literacy North Halton's adult literacy programs.

Those who want to check out the ride in advance can drop by Main Street's Gallinger Ford tomorrow. The local car dealer will be sponsoring the track fees for the car and housing the vehicle in its showroom.

"This is such an amazing opportunity for car buffs," said bee organizer Theresa MacDonald. "The car is even bee-coloured — yellow with black stripes!"

The adult spelling bee keeps getting bigger, organizers said. Last year's event saw the live auction of a ride in a Ferrari Enzo and through sponsorship, the auction and ticket sales, managed to raise more than \$20,000.

Since it began in 2004, the bee has raised more than \$40,000.

The humorous event, sponsored this year by the Bronte Corporate Centre, will see 24 teams — a new record — of three battling for spelling supremacy. Teams represent a variety of local businesses, non-profit agencies and service clubs.

The Milton Mall branch of Royal Bank has won the trophy two years in a row.

Although team positions have all been filled, residents can still enjoy the event by coming out to cheer on the players and participate in the Milton Lions Audience Play-a-Long Bee. Advance tickets cost \$30 and include a meal, but space is limited, so interested folks should get their tickets soon.
