Man seriously injured after falling 21 feet from building


A 49-year-old man remains in serious condition in hospital after falling 21 feet from a ladder and striking his head.

Hamilton resident Hungchiu Mok, a Bell Canada employee, was working on the exterior wall of TDI Transportation on Regional Road 25, north of Hwy. 401, at about 4:30 p.m. Thursday.

He was drilling a hole in the wall while standing on an extension ladder to reach for the boring site when, for unknown reasons, he fell from the ladder, striking his head on a concrete footing as he hit the ground. A passerby heard the victim fall and rushed to the scene.

Mok was taken by air ambulance to Hamilton General Hospital where he remains in serious condition.

concluded their investigation after determining it wasn't a criminal act.

The incident will continue to

be investigated by the Human Resources and Skills Development Canada Labour Program.

Car collides with cement truck on Derry

Two motorists are lucky to be alive after their car collided with a cement truck Monday morning.

Police said that at about 10 a.m., a vehicle traveling north on Walkers Line entered the Derry Road intersection, directly into the path of a westbound

cement truck traveling along Derry Road.

The truck couldn't stop and struck the car, sending it reeling 30 metres off the roadway.

The two occupants of the passenger car received non-life threatening injuries and were taken to hospital. The truck

driver wasn't injured.

There's a stop sign on Walkers Line, but police could-n't comment on whether the car stopped for the sign, as the incident is under investigation.

Derry Road from Guelph Line to Appleby Line was closed until 11 a.m.
