Louis St. Laurent work may be expedited

It looks like the construction timeline for another road in Milton will soon be fast-tracked thanks to an impending financial agreement between the Town and Mattamy Homes.

At its meeting Monday night, the Town's community services committee endorsed having staff negotiate with Mattamy to pay up front for an environmental assessment (EA) and final design of the Louis St. Laurent Boulevard crossing over the Sixteen Mile Creek.

If everything goes planned, work on the section projects would've normally

that runs from Regional Road 25 east over the creek would be advanced from its original 2010 timeframe to next year.

The agreement falls under the Accelerated Transportation Capital Program, which forms a partnership between the Town, Mattamy Homes and in some cases, the Region, to advance construction timelines for major thoroughfares.

Mattamy Homes is fronting funds for the program and will be reimbursed, without interest, in the future when the roads

come forward in municipal budgets.

The initiative responds to the traffic woes that have come with a rapidly growing community.

Town staff estimates the EA and final design work for the Louis St. Laurent project will cost more than \$317,000.

Services Engineering Director Paul Cripps said the Town has yet to have discussions with Mattamy on whether the home building company will front funds for the actual construction. The matter will go before town council May 28.
