Nurses in demand: speaker

Ontario is faced with an increasing demand for nurses and a decreasing supply of them, making it crucial to rethink the way health-care services are delivered.

That was one of the messages delivered by Registered Nurses Association of Ontario president Mary Ferguson-Paré last Friday afternoon to the nursing staff at the Maplehurst Correctional Complex and Vanier Centre for Women.

Ferguson-Paré stopped by Milton to mark Nursing Week and recognize the often-overlooked work nurses in correctional facilities do.

In her talk entitled 'Mind the Gap', she took a look at the future of the nursing profession and what should be done so it remains strong as many of the province's experienced nurses retire.

She said previously, nursing jobs would draw experienced applicants and only those who've put in their time would get to work in areas like critical

"Not any more though," she pointed out.

"We have a huge issue around supply and a big issue around demand. Obviously there is a great need and you're

spread pretty thin."

So what change?

"We really have start having permeable boundaries nurses Ferguson-Paré

and physicians and others are working in a seamless way," Ferguson-Paré said. "We need to think fresh about how we should be using our professional nursing skills."

She highlighted the need for more information technology (IT) support in nursing, noting many nurses are often just carrying around a pen and piece of paper to work on.

"We're sort of driving a horse and buggy down the 401," she

"We don't have really strong

Ferguson-Paré went on to speak about the gap between the work life quality of nursing leaders and their staff, pointing out that often there'll be happy nursing executives but a beleaguered work force.

"We need to be sure the people in leadership positions are in touch with the people out practising," she said.

She described a new 80/20 model of nursing that's being tested where nurses devote 80 per cent of their time to patient care and 20 per cent to professional development and mentoring activities — an initiative that has drawn positive results.

"Nurses in practise need time for scholarly activity," she said. "If you invest differently in how nurses work, it pays off down

She also told the nurses that the work they do at the correctional centre is "heroic."

"I have absolute respect for everything you do," she said. "You're just an inspiration."

The recognition was welcomed by Ian Clarke, Maplehurst's healthcare manager, who said in the past correctional nurses worked in relative anonymity.

"The general public and other nurses really had little awareness of the existence of nurses in corrections," he said.

information supports." Clarke noted he's pleased that over the past couple of years things have happened to shed some light on correctional centre nursing, such as articles in nursing journals and the formation of an interest group in the Registered Nurses Association of Ontario.
