## Long weekend sees break-ins in rural and urban Milton

Homes in both urban and rural Milton were targeted by thieves over the holiday weekend.

Once inside, the master bedroom was ransacked and approximately \$10,000 in cash, Royal Daulton figurines, a Squire guitar and men's and women's jewelry was stolen.

A flat screen TV and computer system were damaged during the incident on Meadowland Crescent, which happened
