SAVIS lobbies government to tackle abuse of women

The Province of Ontario needs to Step it Up! to end violence against women.

The Sexual Assault & Violence Intervention Services of Halton (SAVIS) delivered that message to Oakville MPP Kevin Flynn recently calling for better, faster government action on a number of fronts.

Flynn was front row centre at a May 3 press conference at SAVIS' Hopedale Mall office where SAVIS — backed by nearly a dozen other local organizations, and not just women's groups — sat across the table from Flynn and the audience to outline a 10-point list on how to do it.

The 10 points include:

- understanding that violence against women is an equality rights issue.
- recognizing that male power is upheld by rape and sexual harassment.
 - stopping racism/oppression; make Ontario accessible.
 - ending poverty now.
- creating and maintain housing, non-profit childcare, training now.
 - providing fair access to justice for women.
 - · holding violent men accountable for their actions.
- stopping the criminalization and psychiatrization of women.
 - · demanding secure funding for women's organizations.
- listening to survivors and women's advocates, they are the experts.

Step It Up! kicked off May as Sexual Awareness Month.

"I didn't feel like I was being picked on," said Flynn, who expressed disappointment other Halton government officials were not present. "This message is for Big G government of all levels who have ignored this issue."

SAVIS and many of the associated groups at the conference recognized Flynn as a supporter for their cause.
