## Halton hockey coach faces sex charges

A Halton hockey coach faces multiple charges going back more than a quarter century after two former Burlington players came forward to police last month with allegations of sexual misconduct.

Detectives with Halton Regional Police's Child Abuse and Sexual Assault Unit (CASA) received a complaint from two men in May that prompted them to investigate a former family friend.

The men told police they were victims of a series of assaults committed by their former coach while they were in his care. The charges arise from incidents that allegedly occurred between 1978 and 1981.

Halton detectives say it appears the suspect lived at various homes with host families in Burlington and Milton from 1978 until he moved to Hamilton last month.

Police believe the suspect was also involved in youth soccer and youth bowling.

Police spokesman Sgt. Peter Payne said the ages of the alleged victims at the time of the

incidents are not being provided because it might identify them.

He said the men now live outside Burlington but both have family in the city.

Payne said the sex assaults are believed to have occurred in one-on-one situations when the men were boys.

"Investigators have spoken to individuals at the Burlington Lions Optimist Minor Hockey Association (BLOMHA). The BLOMHA representatives were very helpful," said Payne.
