Jr. Sox run hot and cold

The Junior Red Sox's enigmatic offence reared its ugly head again this past week.

Just two days removed from an encouraging 10-hit attack that led to an 11-7 outdistancing of Georgetown, Milton was pretty much silenced at the plate against the unbeaten powerhouse Mississauga South West Twins Tuesday night.

"There's no question our hitting still needs to improve if we're going to compete against the big boys," said manager Glenn Turner following the 10-0 whitewash.

It was a much different story at Brian Best Park Sunday afternoon, where the Red Sox built up an early cushion on the way to toppling the neighbouring Eagles.

Rural Miltonian Ryan Waller —

who spent last year with Guelph's elite squad — picked up the victory with five shutout innings of one hit ball.

He struck out five visiting batters along the way and left with his team ahead 7-0.

Offensively, shortstop Sean Mathé led with three runs and three RBI, while recording two hits and two runs each were centre fielder Adam Aubie and first baseman Matt Sikorski.

Now 3-3, Milton will look to narrow the gap on the seemingly unbeatable Twins tomorrow afternoon, when the two teams meet again at 4 p.m. at Brian Best — immediately following the Senior Red Sox's game against the Brampton Battlecats.

The juniors close out their weekend home stand Sunday at 1 p.m. versus Stoney Creek.

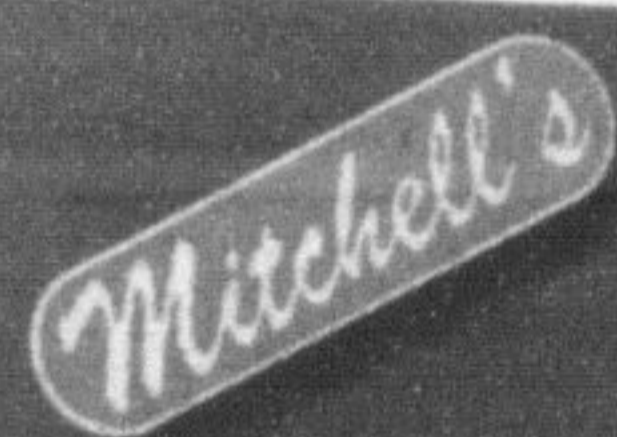
This wiped out the Spartans' hopes for quarterfinal play.
