

## Open house for Tim's Track set for Saturday

Tim DaSilva's dream begins taking shape this Saturday. That's when an open house is set for a Halton Place-based BMX track designed by the 20-year-old Miltonian, who was killed last July during the late stages of construction.

Finished by younger brother and racing partner Chris — along with a host of family members, friends and local racing enthusiasts — Tim's Track will be open to veterans and newcomers alike between 2 and 5 p.m. Bikes and helmets will be available for those wishing to try out the sport. Long-sleeved shirts and pants are required for all racers. A barbecue, music and prizes round out the opening festivities.

"This is a national-level track," noted Chris upon its completion in September, referring to the facility's overall technical difficulty and specifically the rhythm section on the third straight.

The track's first official race is slated for July 14 and 15 — marking the anniversary of Tim's passing — with round two of the Ontario Provincial Cup Series. The first day will serve as a national ranking event, with top riders advancing to the Eastern Canadian Championships.

A season pass for area riders costs \$65.

Halton Place is located on No. 15 Sideroad, between Milton and Acton.

## Sr. Sox lay waste to lowly Brampton

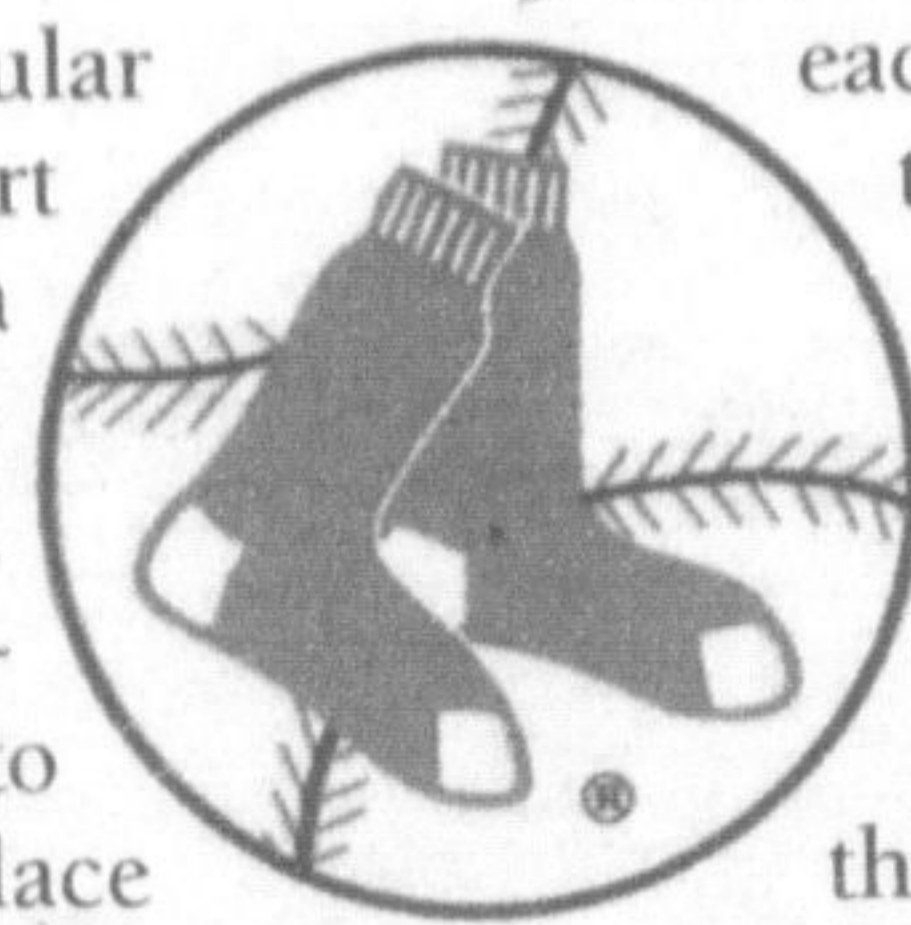
The Senior Red Sox enjoyed an embarrassment of riches at Brian Best Park Saturday.

Despite missing regular starters Nick Aalbers and Kurt Mitchell, Milton managed a commanding follow-up to its Tillsonburg Tournament triumph — amassing a season-high 19 hits en route to clobbering the last-place Brampton Battlecats 15-3.

The seven-inning mercy — featuring a whopping eight doubles — lifted the Red Sox to 5-6 in league play.

Just about everyone contributed to the onslaught, which was sparked by a

couple of hard-fought battles at the plate early on by third baseman Joe Jurus and centre fielder Jeff MacLeod, each of whom finished with three hits.



Jurus drove in three runs and scored three times himself, while MacLeod came in twice and had two RBI.

One of two others with three hits on the day, designated hitter Kevin Wilson drove in four runs, while right fielder Matt Tales had three hits and three runs.

Three other players had multi-hit efforts.

Meanwhile, Adam Ahearn was

pretty much in cruise control after giving up a leadoff homer in the first — scattering five hits and two walks over a rock-solid six innings.

Highlighting a credible defensive campaign were a second-inning double play and replacement catcher Curt Davies' gun down of a runner at second in the final frame.

The Red Sox will look to climb to .500 tonight, when they begin a two-game road trip against Glanbrook. Tomorrow they're in Burlington, while Saturday they return to Brian Best for a 1:30 p.m. start with Dundas.

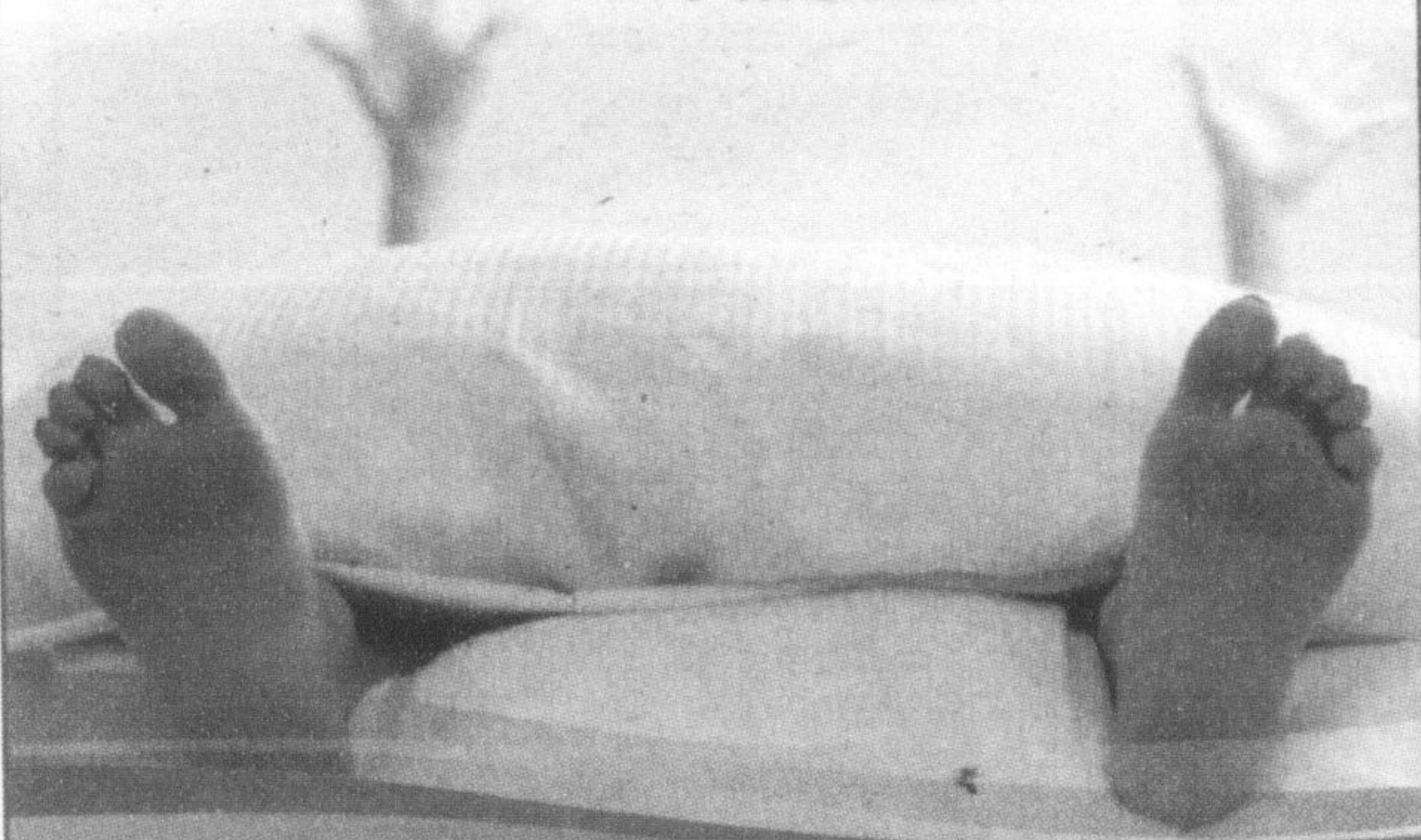
