## Region eyes air monitor for Milton

#### Committee grants initial approval

A regional program that would address air quality at the community level took a preliminary step forward recently.

At its meeting last Tuesday, the Region's health and social services committee endorsed the initiative that would see a stationary air monitor set up in Milton — since Modelling can even predict the munities have expressed the need

they already exist in south Halton - and a portable monitor purchased to measure air pollution in different locations across the community.

It would also include air quality modeling, which uses sophisticated computer models to estimate the concentration of different air pollutants and examine emission sources separately.


