

Conservation efforts could get kids on television

Are you a youth who's doing something to conserve, preserve or celebrate the environment? Then a local production company is looking to put you on TV.

As Promised Productions, which took top place in a recent contest, is using its prize money — \$10,000 — to help fund an environmental kids' television series currently being developed.

"We're inviting kids who live in Ontario's Greenbelt region to log onto www.aspromisedproductions.com and tell us what they're doing to make a difference

for the environment," said David Di Giorgio, music teacher at E.C. Drury High School and co-founder of As Promised Productions.

Based on submissions, Di Giorgio and business partner Toni Grates will visit selected kids on their fall Greenbelt Tour, where the students will have a chance to show their work first hand and maybe even be featured on the new TV series.

As Promised Productions recently won the Greenbelt of Ontario Prize for its creation of Magic of the Mist, an eight-minute dance piece celebrating the legendary icicle

fairies who live in the mist of Niagara Falls.

The competition, sponsored by CHUM TV and the Friends of the Greenbelt Foundation, was seeking works of art that celebrate the diversity and beauty of Ontario's Greenbelt region.

Hundreds of entries were received and narrowed down to the top 10, which were posted on the City TV website, where viewers voted for their favourite.

Magic of the Mist won with 48 per cent of the overall vote.

As Promised Productions creates and pro-

duces original works that celebrate the diversity and uniqueness of Canada.

"Winning the Greenbelt prize shows me that we are on the right track and reaching our goals as a company and that is truly satisfying," said Grates, who wrote, directed and co-choreographed the piece.

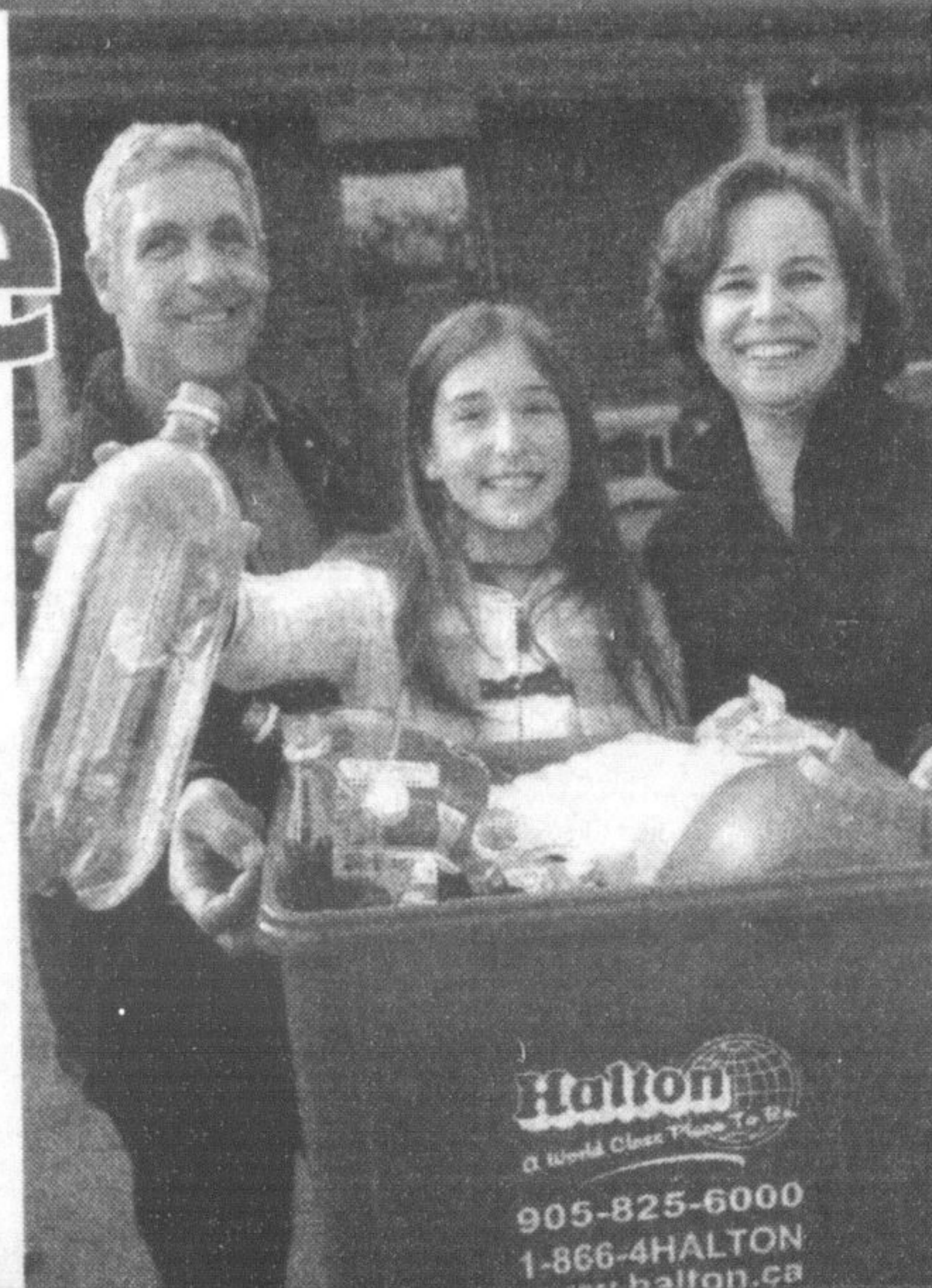
