CT scanner goal now \$5 million

The Milton District Hospital (MDH) Foundation has pushed the fundraising goal for its CT scanner campaign to new heights now that a local developer has made a large pledge.

Orlando Corporation has committed to match every dollar up to \$750,000 that's raised over the next year for the new equipment, allowing the foundation to bump its \$3.5-million target up to \$5 million.

The additional funds will be used to acquire further support equipment for the diagnostic imaging department.

"Matching gifts inspire our donors because

they know the value of their gift doubles," said foundation director of development Donna McLaughlin. "Orlando Corporation's pledge will provide a significant incentive to encourage donors to give even more generously."

Orlando Corporation president Phil King said the company is excited about its new relationship with the foundation.

"The people of Milton should not have to travel to other hospitals to obtain a CT scan," he said. "Milton is growing at a fast pace and the facilities at the hospital must keep pace."

With the new goal of \$5 million, the CT scanner and diagnostic imaging renewal campaign is one of the most ambitious fundraisers the foundation has even undertaken.

All the funds raised will cover the cost of purchasing the new scanner, renovating the existing space to accommodate the scanner, renewing current diagnostic imaging equipment and building an annex to expand the size of MDH's current diagnostic imaging depart-

Each year more than 2,900 Milton residents require a CT scan.
