

Steeles Ave. store hit three times in three days

Bomar Bargain Barn on Steeles Avenue was the target of three thefts within a three-day period.

Last Saturday during the day, two females and a male entered the store. While the females distracted the employee, the male shoplifted almost \$20,000 in watches, police said. A shopper noticed what was happening and alerted the owner, but by that time the trio had fled.

Two days later, around 1:30 a.m. Monday, the store was broken into by an unknown suspect, who pried open the front door and stole a safe that contained an undisclosed amount of cash,

police said.

Just four hours later, after police had left the scene, the store was broken into again, this time through the rear entrance, which was pried open. Inventory — mostly watches — was stolen.

Police are still tabulating the total value of merchandise and cash stolen.

Vehicle stolen

The victim screamed for the man to leave and the suspect fled westbound through the lot.

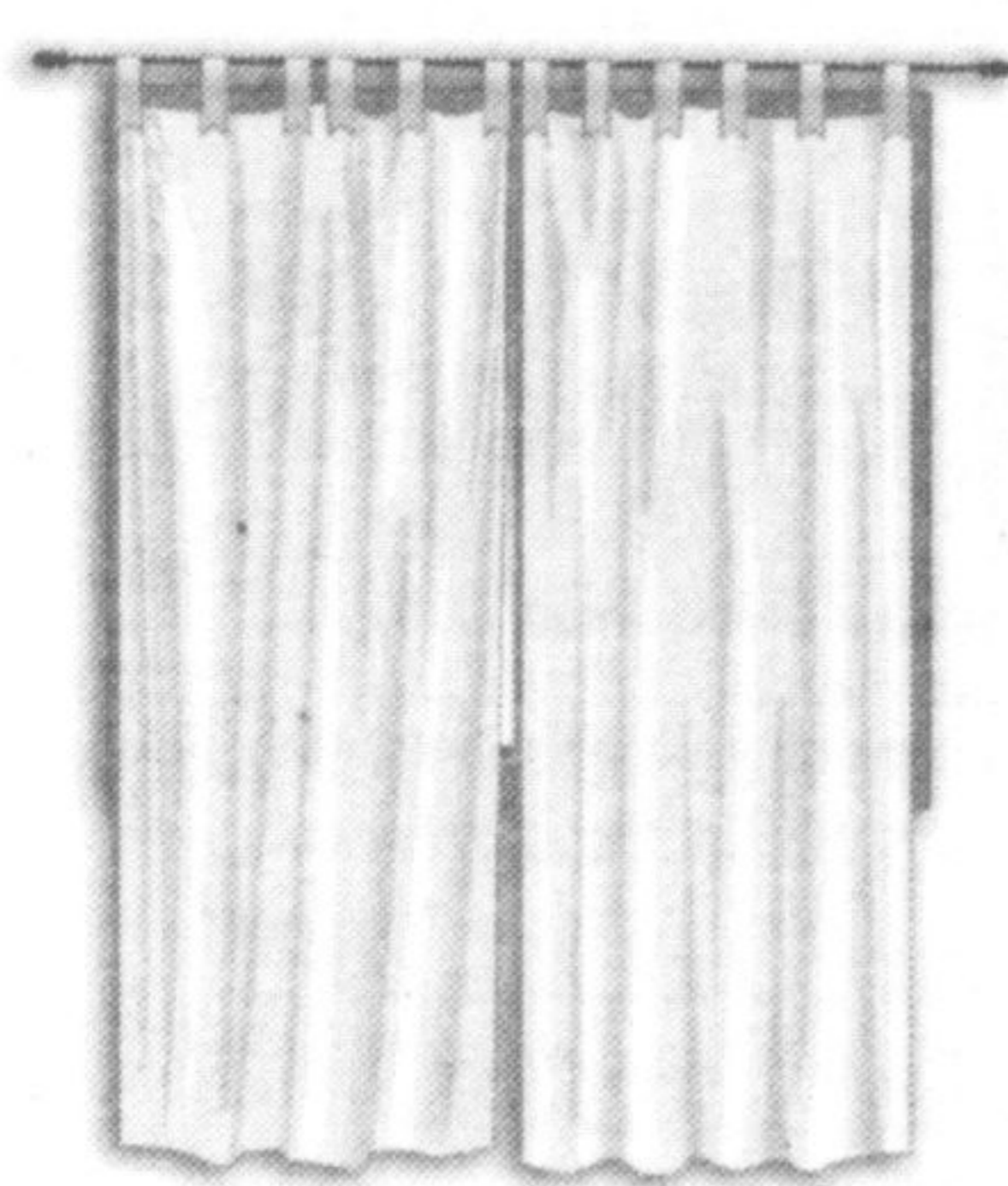
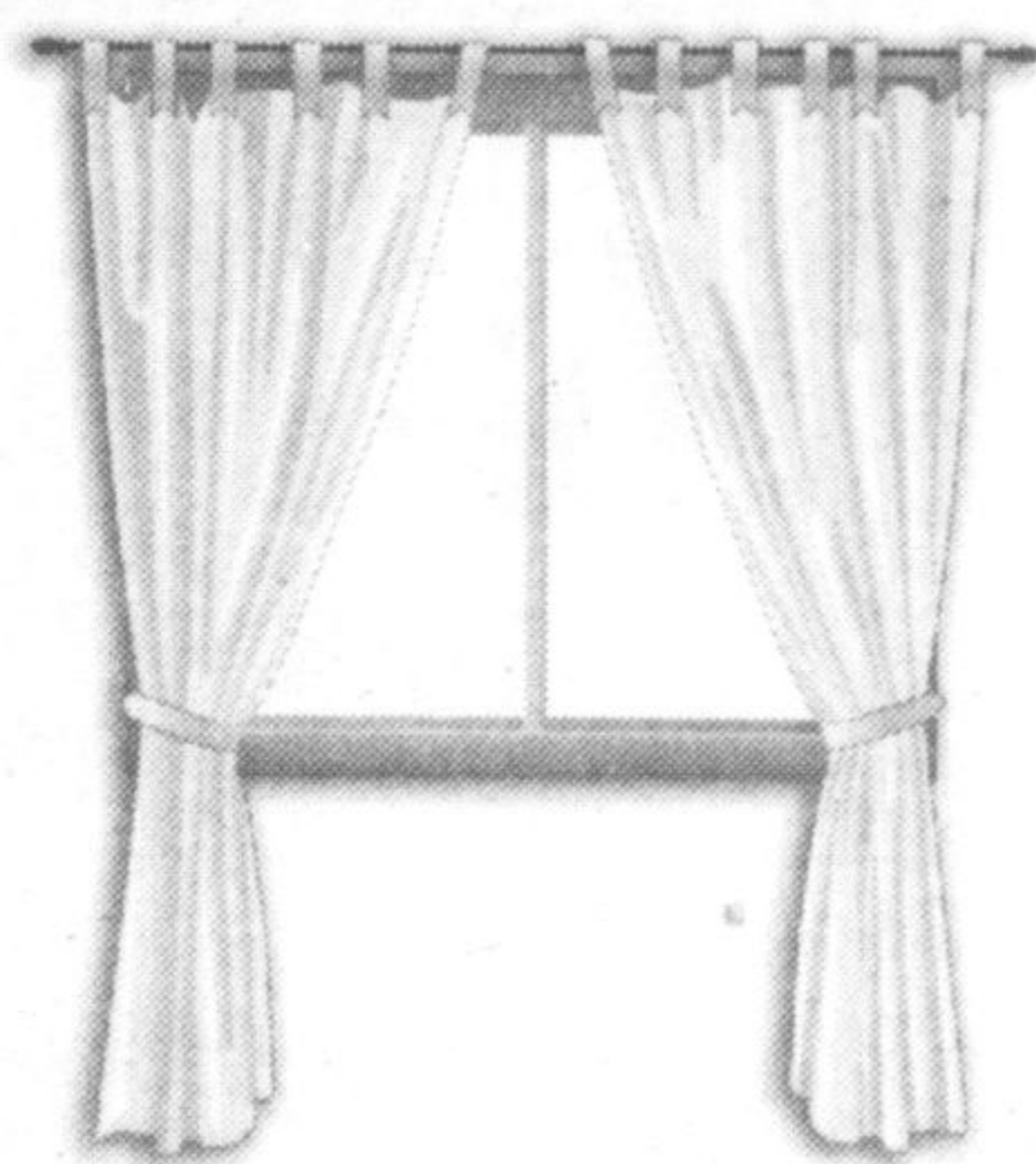
The suspect is described as white, in

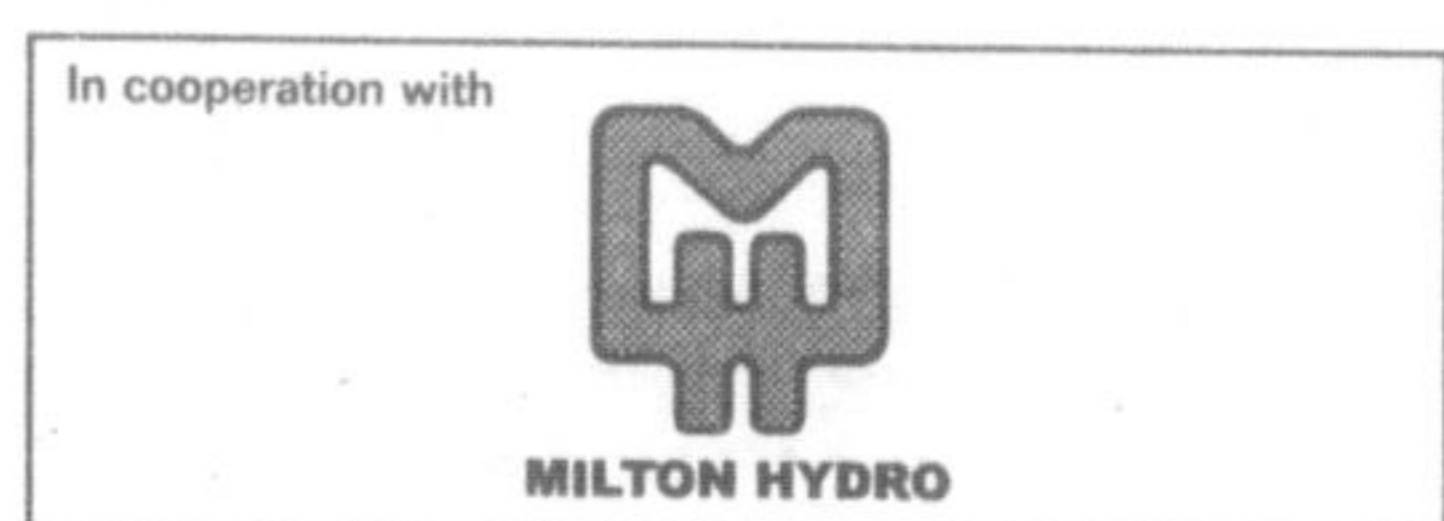

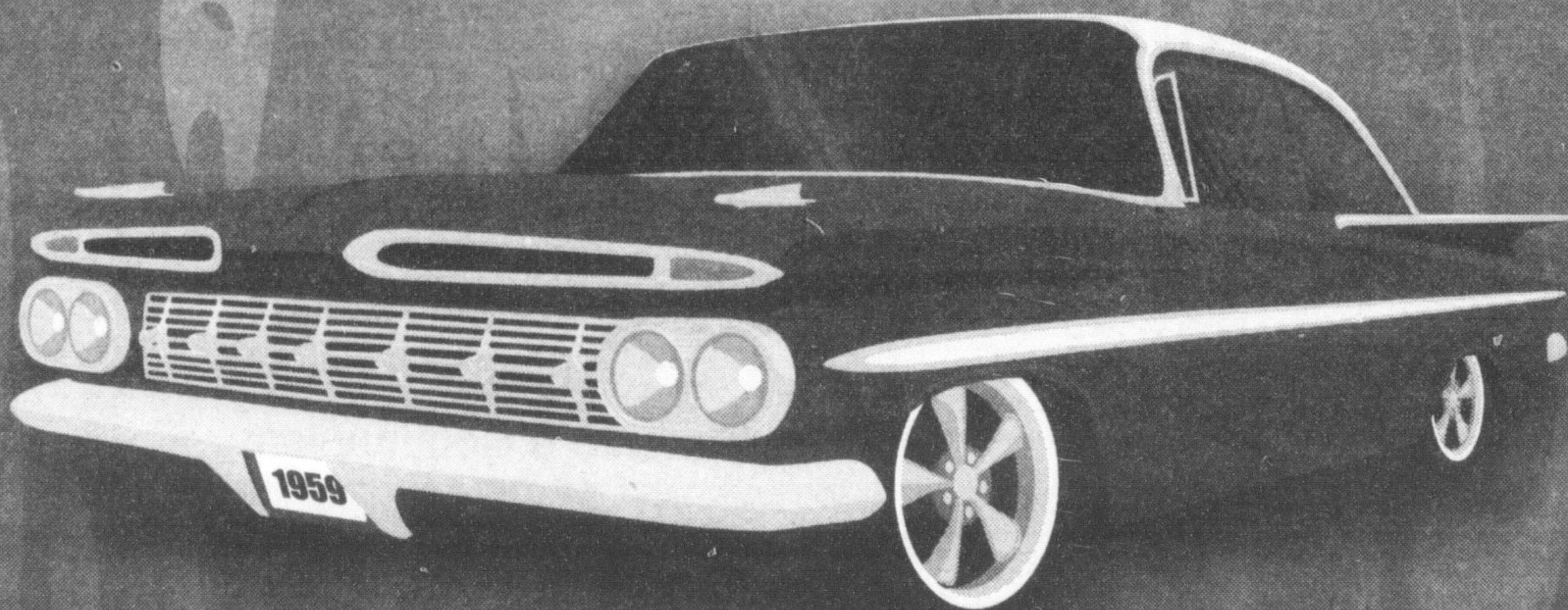

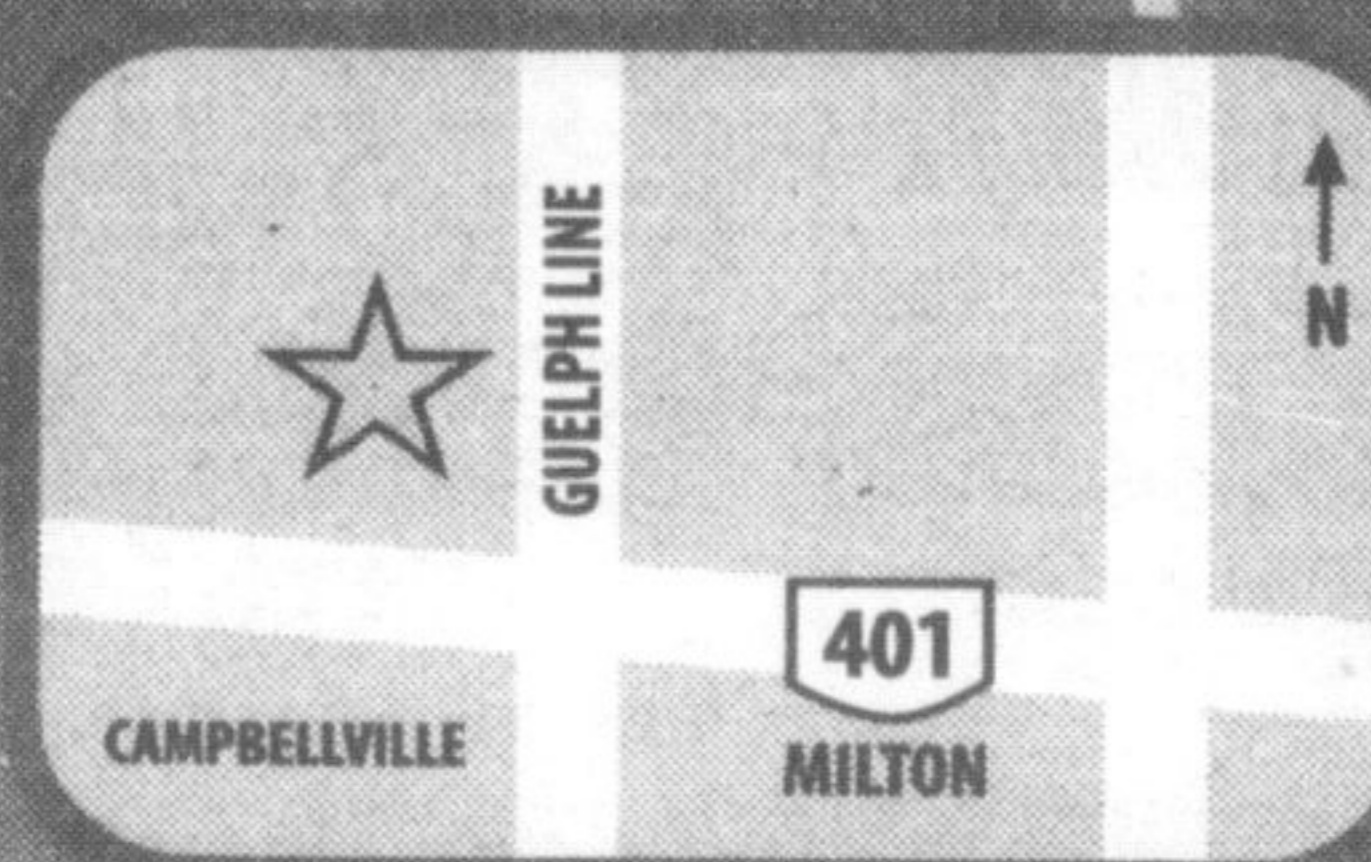
