

# Trio charged with mischief

Charges were laid against three Milton residents after havoc was wreaked at a home last week.

Police said sometime overnight August 2, a Frobisher Boulevard home had a dead fish thrown in its pool, flour and eggs smeared on its porch and ketchup squirted on the homeowners' vehicle.

Police investigated the incident and four people were arrested.

A 15-year-old girl, a 19-year-old male and a 21-year-old male — all from Milton — were each charged with mischief, along with a 19-year-old Toronto man.

The 21-year-old Milton man was also the subject of an outstanding warrant for his arrest, with police looking for him in

both London, Ont., and Saskatchewan in connection with fraud, theft and possession of stolen property, said Halton police.

He was turned over to London police and taken into custody.

### Racist graffiti discovered

Police are investigating after racial epithets were recently spray painted on the outside of Brookville Public School.

Police said unknown suspects used black paint to write profanity and racist comments on 10 different spots at the rear of the school sometime between last Friday and Tuesday. The damage was discovered by a

maintenance worker.

Cigarettes stolen from gas station

Cartons of cigarettes were the target of a theft at a local gas station Sunday morning.

Police said the employee left the Regional Road 25 Olco store for about two minutes to fill two propane tanks at about 10 a.m. When he returned, he found a locked cabinet in the back of the store had been pried open and 12 cartons of cigarettes — valued at a total of \$875 — had been stolen.

The employee believes he was purposely distracted by the customer who asked for his propane tank to be filled so an accomplice could swipe the cigarettes.

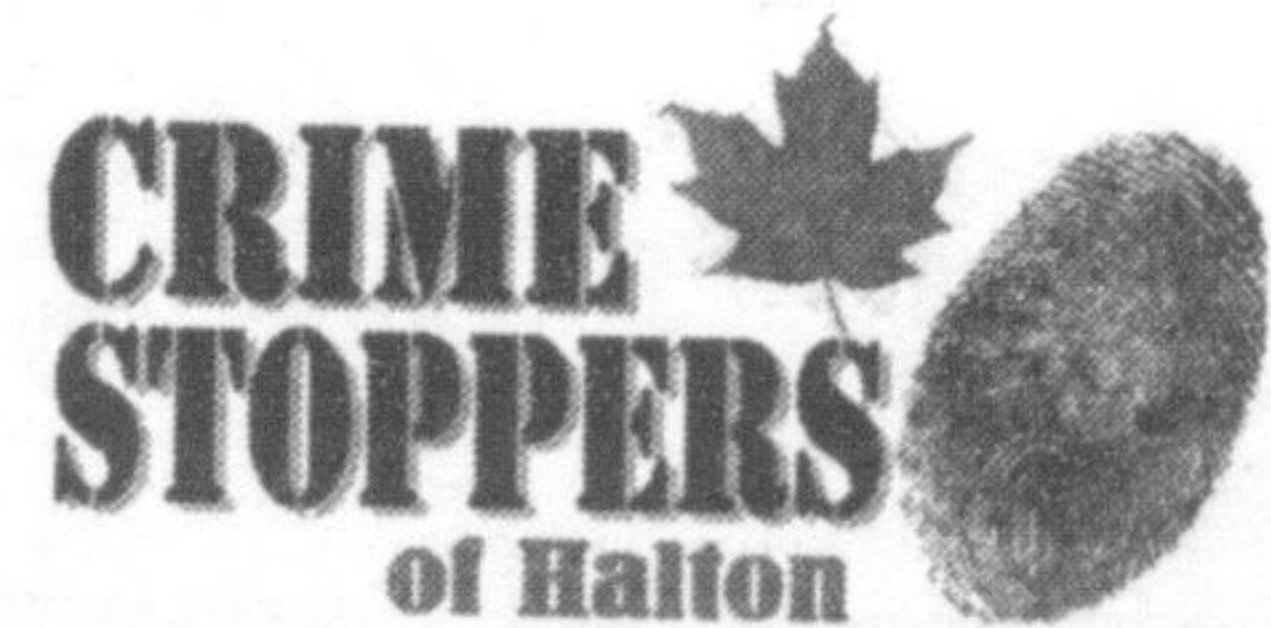

# Thieves target liquidation centre

Halton Regional Police are investigating a break-in at a liquidation centre.

Around 5:30 a.m. July 16, suspects pried open a loading bay door at the rear of Bomar Bargain Barn, 311 Steeles Ave. E. Once inside, the suspects pried open a glass display cabinet and removed about \$3,000 worth of watches.

This was the second break-in to this business that evening. Earlier that night, suspects had



broken into the business and stolen the safe.

The business was also the victim of a shoplifting incident July 14 where three Cartier watches and one Gucci watch were stolen.

The three suspects in the

incident are described as having darker olive-type skin. The stolen watches are valued at \$19,000.
