Little left for OBAs after intense COBA playoff run

Some solid relief work by a latearriving John Brady helped keep things close.

From there, Milton was sent packing Saturday morning with a 5-4 defeat to the Barrie Red Sox, who broke a scoreless stalemate with four runs in the fifth en route to their narrow victory.

Sikorski cashed in Nick Vipond for a second straight game and Trevor Hall delivered a two-run single in the sixth to keep hopes for advancement alive.

Splitting the pitching duties were Scott McTrach and Sean Mathé.

The Red Sox would double their hit total to eight, but just couldn't capitalize with runners in scoring position.

Volleyball coaches being sought


