

Man dies after bizarre fall

A strange set of circumstances led to the death of a 51-year-old Milton man who fell from his second-storey roof on Main Street East Wednesday night.

Police said the victim — whose name hadn't been released at press time - was relaxing with a friend shortly before 6 p.m. on the rooftop of his multi-unit apartment when he was swarmed by hornets from a nearby nest and stung.

"While attempting to swat (them) and retreat, he apparently fell from the roof," Halton Regional Police Sgt. Peter Payne told the Champion.

He landed on the pavement below, sustaining serious head injuries, and was attended to by Halton police and EMS workers, who transported him to Milton District Hospital.

Shortly after, he was airlifted to St. Michael's Hospital in Toronto where he succumbed to his injuries at about 10:20 p.m., Payne said.

It wasn't known at press time whether alcohol was a factor in the fall, which appears to have been accidental, police said.

Two witnesses to the tragic accident — the man who was with the victim on the rooftop and another individual who saw the fall from ground level — have been assisting police in their investigation, which is ongoing, Payne said.

An autopsy was scheduled for yesterday. The identity of the victim was being withheld

Halton off the hook

Province to take back social program costs By Kim Arnott

Halton's costs over the coming four years, following an announcement on Monday by the provincial government.

At the annual general meeting of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) in Ottawa, the Liberal government announced a plan to take back \$935 million in social program costs currently being paid by the province's municipalities.

Halton Regional Chair Gary Carr said the announcement was "very good news" for local taxpayers.

"It's a good step in the right direction," said Carr, who noted that most municipal politicians agree social pro-
