Milton man charged in recent break-ins

A Milton man has been arrested and charged in connection with five break-ins and failing to remain at the scene of an accident.

The arrest was made August 27, shortly after a Halton Hills auto repair shop on Trafalgar Road was broken into.

Police said a Jaguar that had been at the shop for repair was stolen and involved in a collision in Oakville that night. There was also a break-in and an attempted break-in at residences in Oakville.

An 18-year-old Merritt Drive male was charged with two counts of break and enter, two counts of possession of stolen property, failing to stop at the scene of an accident, attempted break and enter, and two counts of breach of probation.

The suspect was additionally charged with break and enter and possession of stolen property in connection to the break-in of an Ontario Street North residence August 23, and two more counts of break and enter in connection to the break-ins of two Steeles Avenue homes overnight August 24 and 26.

He was also charged with two counts of fail to comply with probation.

Three vehicles stolen

Three vehicles — two of them luxury vehicles — were stolen this week by unknown suspects.

In the first incident, a black, four-door 2006 BMW BX5 valued at \$76,000 was stolen Tuesday between 1:30 and 7 a.m. from a driveway on Ramshaw Crescent. Its licence plate is AYL821.

Sometime between 8 and 10:30 a.m., also Tuesday, a 2004 Honda Civic worth \$20,000 was swiped from the driveway of Milton District High School on Williams Avenue.

The beige four-door vehicle had the

licence plate ATYK254.

And between Sunday and Tuesday, a 2005 white Hummer H2 was stolen from the parking lot of Auto Connect Superstore on Steeles Avenue. The vehicle was unlicensed and valued at \$35,000.

Painkillers stolen

Police are asking for the public's help in locating an assortment of medication stolen from a vehicle Monday just before 10 a.m.

Police said the car was parked in front of a business at Charles and Main streets when unknown suspects entered the unlocked vehicle and took a white straw purse. Inside were a spare set of keys and about 220 pills of various painkillers.

Narcotics swiped

A substantial amount of narcotics and cash were stolen from a Derry Road pharmacy early Saturday morning.

Unknown suspects pried open the front door to gain entry to the ground floor of the medical building, said police, who responded to an alarm at the building shortly before 2 a.m.

Police are investigating.

Safe stolen

A safe containing six laptop computers and cash was stolen overnight August 28 from a mobile office parked at Milton Mall.

Police said unknown suspects gained access to a motor home being used as an office by Employment Ontario through a small window.

Five of the computers are silver Dell laptops, while one is a black Toshiba.

The value of the stolen property is \$6,000.
