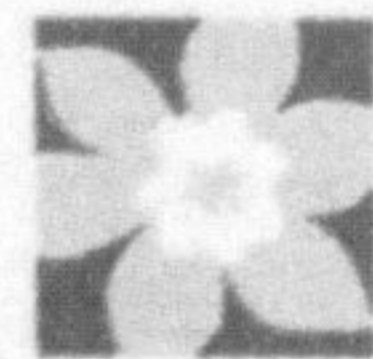
Take a leisurely 3 to 5 kilometre, non-competitive, pledge-based walk on the grounds of scenic **Country Heritage Park.**

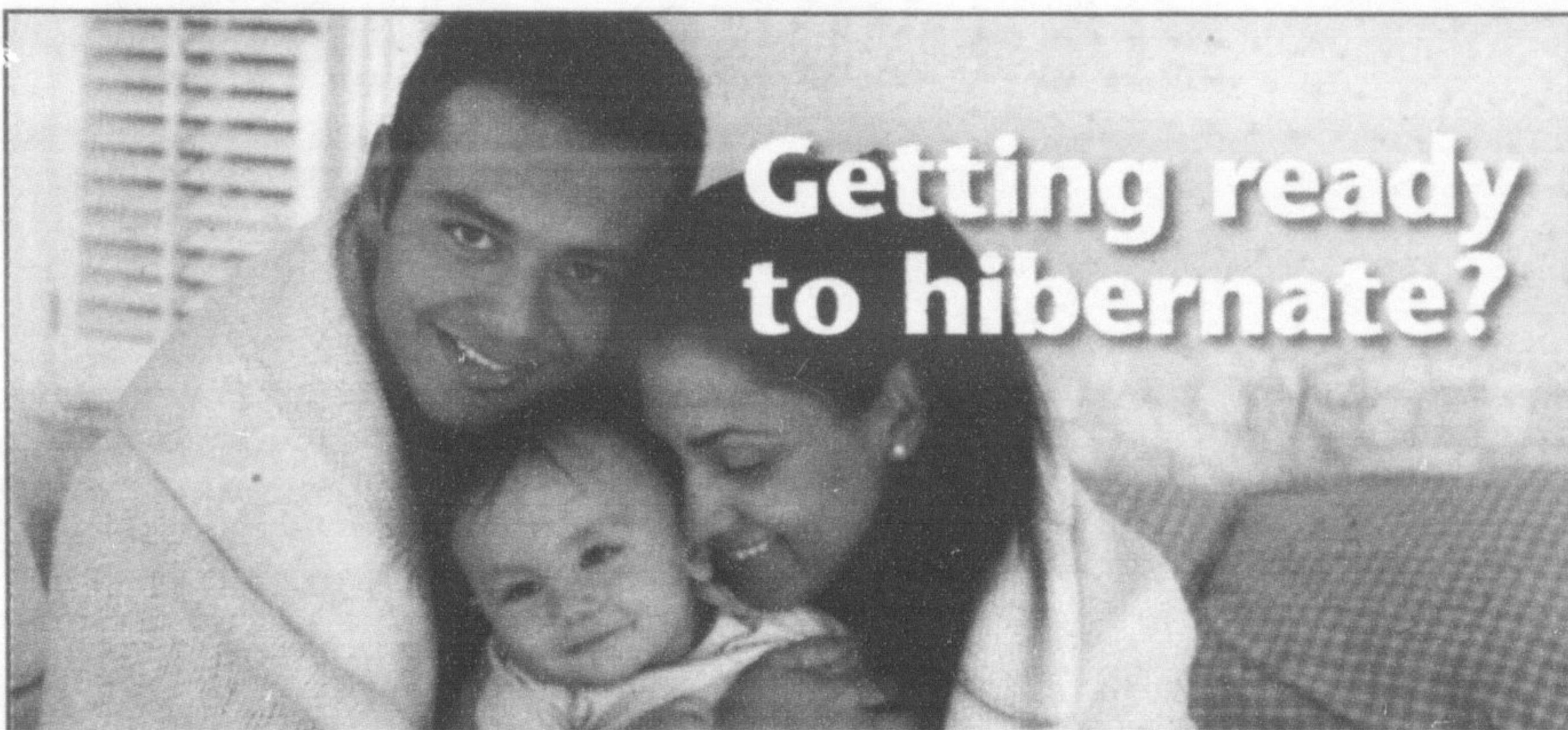

Development 'out of sync': Best, Scherer tell council

 per cent build out before you can move on," he said.

Ward 3 Councillor Cindy Lunau noted that the Milton Chamber of Commerce also wanted to make sure 'old Milton' isn't separated from 'new Milton,' so the thought at the time was to have the old part of town sandwiched between new development on both the east and west sides.

Ward 2 Councillor Mike Boughton, who's also a Main Street business owner, emphasized that the downtown has to be protected.

After hearing from his fellow councillors, Scherer said, "Maybe we should be taking a harder look going forward on some of these developments and try to see if we can start balancing the needs of the city and the taxpayer and putting infrastruc-

ture in place."

Both he and Best characterized Milton's development as being "out of sync."

While Ward 2 Councillor Greg Nelson and Best pushed to have his motion included in the motion regarding Mattamy's development, Iovio suggested making it a separate resolution.

"It would be unfair if this one particular development was held up for this reason," he said.

A few councillors in attendance voiced concerns that refusing Mattamy's needed approval or delaying it while waiting for a commitment from the Region for infrastructure could land the Town at an expensive Ontario Municipal Board hearing that it would likely lose.

"Saying we don't have enough capacity at the hospital or our roads are not in good

enough shape are not seen as grounds for refusal," said Ward 4 Councillor Wendy Schau.

She added that the Town has to concentrate its efforts on keeping services up with growth.

"If that does involve an increase in taxes, so be it," she said.

"I think we need to bite the bullet and do what we have to do to keep up with services."

In the end, the committee endorsed two separate motions — Best's motion dealing with infrastructure needs and the other supporting about 400 new homes in the fourth phase of Mattamy's west-end development.

The motions will go before town council on Monday.
