Farley bike trek expected to net \$25,000

A Milton animal lover undertook the bicycle ride of a lifetime recently, cycling more than 260 km to raise money for a special cause.

Darren Osborne of the Ontario Veterinary Medical Association (OVMA), based out of Milton, took part in the September 13 Ride For Farley, a fundraiser for the OVMA's Farley Foundation.

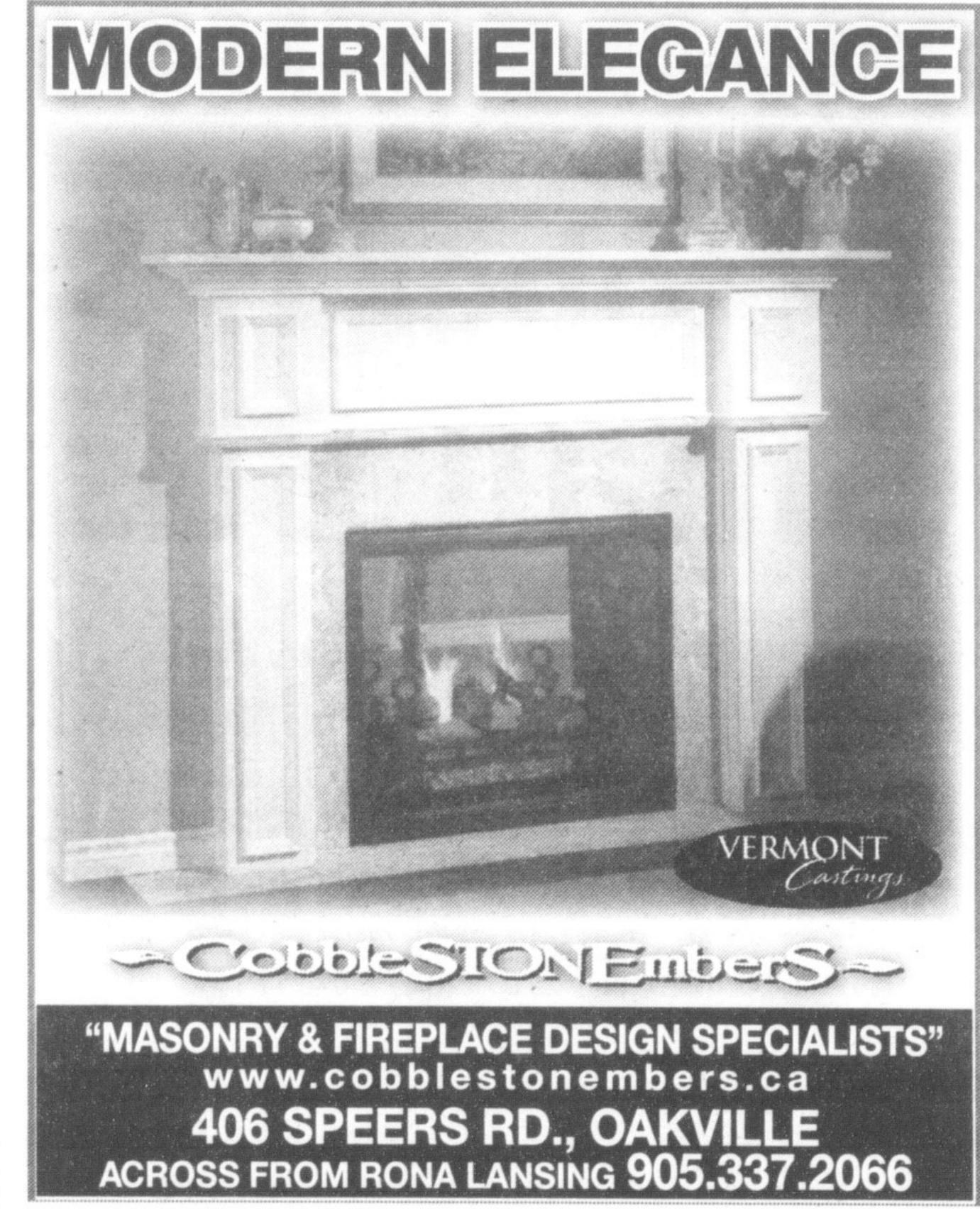
The Farley Foundation is a charitable organization that assists seniors and disabled people on limited incomes to afford emergency vet treatment for their pets. The organization is named after the affable English sheepdog from cartoonist Lynn Johnston's For Better or For Worse comic strip.

Osborne was riding alongside 18 other vets and animal health industry professionals from around Ontario, some of whom were riding 261 km and some 100 km.

The ride, which began in Mindemoya, Ont., and concluded in Killarney, Ont., took about 10 hours.

Each cyclist aimed to raise a minimum of \$1,000 for peo-

ple and pets in need. Last year's ride raised more than \$15,000, with this year's event expected to net close to \$25,000 once the final tallies are in.
