

Affordable housing subdivision planned

Plans are in the works for a unique subdivision of 150 affordable homes on the Ninth Line in south Milton.

The initiative, led by the non-profit corporation Regenesis Community Living Inc., calls for a mix of affordable housing types — 50 rental units focused on meeting the needs

of singles and childless couples (25 per cent to be designated as supportive housing for victims of abuse and the mentally handicapped), another 50 rental units geared to families with children (with some of the units also dedicated for supportive housing) and 50 Habitat for Humanity homes.

The proposed subdivision would also include a community services centre designed to meet the physical, social and spiritual needs of the residents, such as through

tutoring services and a breakfast club.

The hope is that with the proper supports, it will be possible for those who need subsidized rent to eventually become owners of affordable homes, such as those built by Habitat for Humanity, said Regenesis president Derk Maat.

The property is on the west side of Ninth Line, north of Eglington Avenue, on the Halton/Peel boundary.

Intersection dangerous: residents

A local woman is calling on the Town to put a four-way stop at a south Milton intersection after her house was struck by a car on the weekend for the second time in five months.

Yates Drive resident Denise Dawes said people have been using her street as "their own little speedway" and ignoring the rules of the road, particularly around the corner of Yates and March Crossing. Her home is the second house in from the intersection.

"To have my house hit twice in a five-month period is a great indication that nobody is obeying the two stop signs that are there," she said. "I think it's time that the (Town) planners rethink their decision about placing a
