Sometime between 11 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. on September 18, unknown suspects entered a home on Kelso Road and stole a ladies 18 karat white-gold, diamond engagement ring and two cordless phones — with a total value of \$8,000.

A second ladies white-gold diamond ring of unknown value was also stolen.

There was no sign of forced entry.

Thousands of dollars worth of construction equipment was stolen during a break-in to a fenced compound at the Home Depot overnight Friday.

Police said an unknown suspect gained entry through the fence and proceeded to swipe \$24,000 worth of equipment used to compact soil.

Sprinkler system swiped

The utility room of one of the buildings at the new Trinity Common plaza on Main Street was broken into last weekend.

Police said unknown suspects entered the building sometime between 1 p.m. Saturday and 8 a.m. Monday. A commercial sprinkler valve system valued at \$6,000 was stolen.

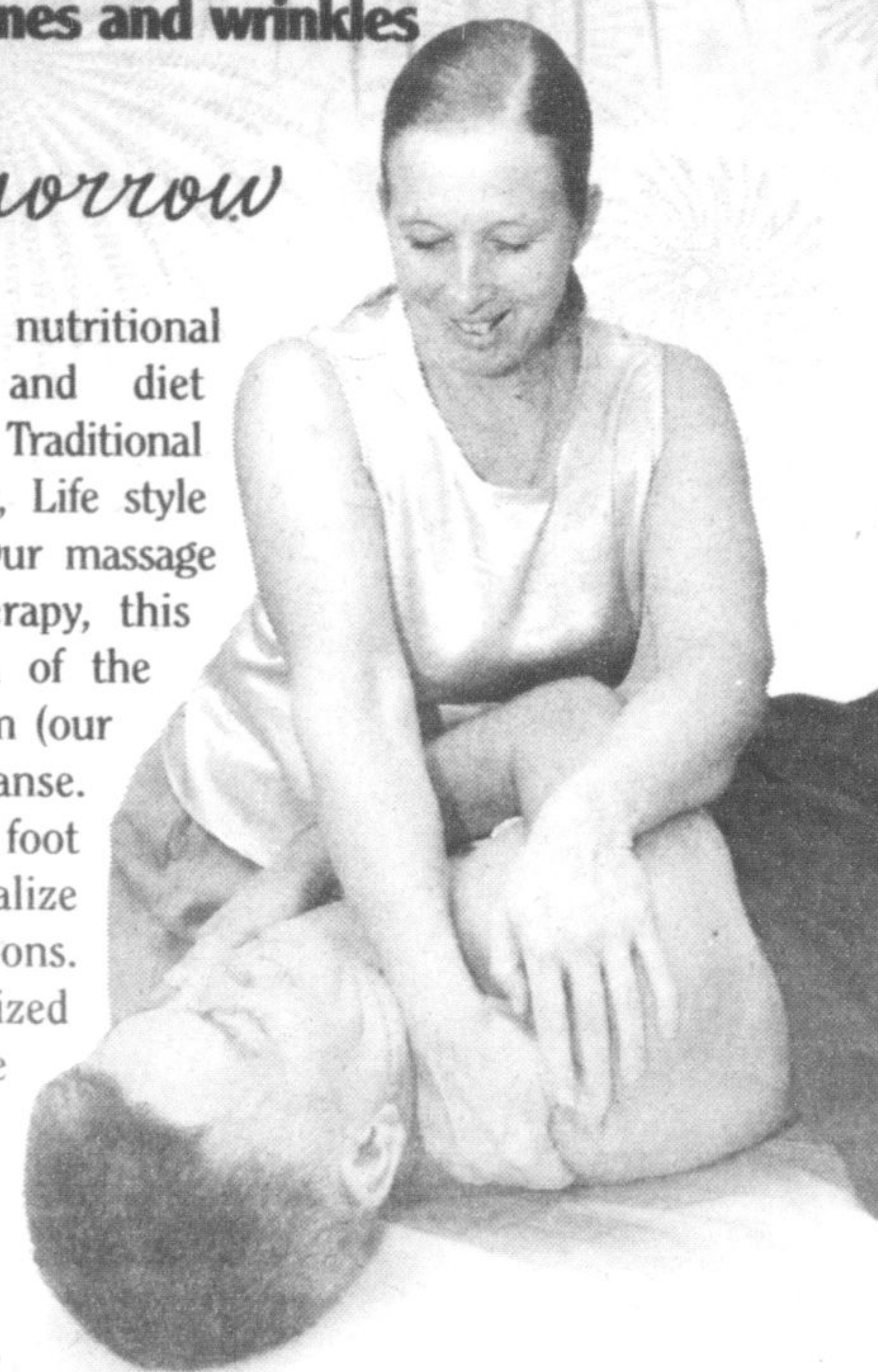
