## Royals net quarterfinal upset

Great team effort powers BR junior v-ballers past Loyola

The Loyola Hawks looked poised to soar to the regional championship, but Bishop Reding had other plans.

Fresh off a hard-fought payback victory over White Oaks, the Royals' junior volleyball team staged a 2-0 (25-22, 25-14) upset over the Richardson Division's top-seated school in quarterfinal cross-over play Tuesday afternoon.

Even with its setter sidelined with a broken hand, Loyola had to be considered the favourite, with home-floor advantage and a 9-1 regular-season record.

But Reding was far from a long-shot, having gone 8-3 in the Richardson loop and operating at optimum efficiency following their tough firstround triumph.

"We're peaking at the right time and really coming together as a team," said head coach Patti Beam.

With some strong overall play — in particular exceptional coverage from Patrick Luzny and Daniel Husarewych — the Royals delivered an impressive finish to squeak by in game one before totally dominating the second set.

Added Beam, "The first game was kind of a mess, with errors back and forth, but the second game was all ours. We led by seven or eight points Rhysee Noel and Lauren Furik.
