
Adult store broken into

Chase ends in Milton; man charged with drunk driving

A car chase that started in Burlington wrapped up in Milton thanks to the quick actions of local police officers.

The pursuit of a 1994 Camaro began just before 4 p.m. Wednesday, police said, and Milton officers were alerted that the driver was suspected of dangerous driving and fleeing police. The chase was discontinued for safety reasons.

A short time later, an officer spotted the sought-after car on Guelph Line near Steeles Avenue. He attempted to stop the vehicle, but the driver refused to pull over. The car then mounted a curb on Campbell Avenue Campbellville. The driver, uninjured, exited the car and an arrest was made.

A 33-year-old Hamilton man has been charged with dangerous driving, impaired driving, having over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood, flight from police and recognizance of bail.

He was also charged with numerous offences including using unauthorized plates, driving with a suspended licence and having no insurance.


Diamond ring found
