Year in Review

No doubt 2007 rich in local news

The past 12 months have held no shortage of controversy, change and unusual circumstances for local residents. In other words, it was another news-rich year for Milton.

Here, in chronological order (as much as possible) are the top events that made the biggest headlines.

Rash of robberies hit Milton

The year began with a series of robberies at

local convenience stores and gas stations. A total of six occurred in 2007's first month, with the most serious resulting in an employee being pistol-whipped at Sam's Store. The rash prompted many store owners to either close early or take extra precautions, as well as appeal to area politicians for assistance. In March police charged a Milton teen in connection with two of the robberies, including the pistol-whipping incident.

Controversy continues for MP
